WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks closed higher Monday as investors remained confident that stimulus measures from global central banks will help spur economic growth. Gains were led by the so-called consumer discretionary sector, which includes retailers like Coach, Urban Outfitters and Gap, ahead of the crucial holiday sales season. The Dow Jones industrial average and the Standard & Poor's 500 index edged further into record territory.

SIoux FALLS — Tippy Tow is being offered over the long Thanksgiving holiday weekend for motorists who feel unsafe behind the wheel after drinking. AAA South Dakota will give the driver, up to one more person and the vehicle a free ride home, no questions asked. "The numbers are fairly staggering," said Marilyn Buskohl, spokeswoman for AAA South Dakota. "Over the last five years, 36 percent of

all fatal crashes in the state involved alcohol or drugs. These crashes have taken the lives of an average of 41 South Dakotans annually. That's three fatalities every month. Tippy Tow provides an easy, safe option to drinking and driving." Tippy Tows are available from 6 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 26, until 2 a.m. Monday, Dec. 1, in Sioux Falls, Rapid City, Mitchell and Yankton. "The community service

is open to AAA members and non-members alike but there is just one place AAA will take you and your car and that's home," said Buskohl. To request a Tippy Tow, call 1-800-AAA-HELP (222-4357) and say, "I need a Tippy Tow." AAA will do the rest. Tows are limited to within a 15-mile radius from point of pickup and are offered free during the 104 hours of the long Thanksgiving weekend. "Don't roll the dice and take unnecessary chances," said Buskohl. "There are just too many alternatives to driving drunk. Designate a non-drinking driver, call a cab or a ride-sharing service, or take advantage of AAA's Tippy Tow."
