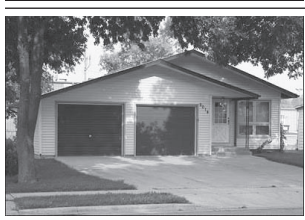

moment by moment." McVay and Pearson decided to create the meditation group after the success of their presentations. "We saw how complimentary the teachings of Jesus and Buddha were," said Pearson. "Both of the teachings are so rich, deep and life-changing that it won't have real meaning unless there's a practice to go along with it."

The sessions consist of introductory explanations about the type of meditation they will be doing, then have an approximately 20-minute guided meditation that's led by either Pearson or McVay. After that, they have a question-and-answer session and the participants commenting on how their meditation practices have been going throughout the week. One or two more meditation practices then follow.

"The reason we teach this is that it's vitally important for people to understand that everybody has this ability to have this type of conscious awareness," said McVay.

Meditation practices are gaining popularity across the globe, said Pearson.

"Meditation is being taught in schools to help the kids settle themselves and its being taught on a corporate level to help executives with stress," he said. "It's a practice for all ages."

McVay knows first-hand that meditation is a useful practice based on his past teaching experience.

"It's been medically proven that meditation counteracts the stress response people get," he said. "Meditation gives us the ability to get to know our minds better and helps with less reactivity."

Pearson finds his meditation inspiration from Thich Nhat Hanh, a Vietnamese Buddhist monk, teacher and author, who uses ordinary objects to help people find their "interbeing."

**Youths Across US Suing To Push Government On Climate Change**

SEATTLE (AP) — They can't vote yet, but dozens of young people want a say in the planet's future, so minors nationwide have been suing states and the federal government in recent years to push action on climate change.

They say their generation will bear the brunt of global warming and that government at every level has an obligation to protect natural resources, including the atmosphere, as a "public trust" for future generations.

The Oregon-based nonprofit Our Children's Trust has been leading efforts to file lawsuits or administrative petitions in every state and against the federal government. Some of the youth-led cases have been dismissed, while others are pending in

states including Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, North Carolina and Oregon.

"None of them have gotten to the finish line," said Michael Gerrard, a professor and director of the Sabin Center for Climate Change Law at Columbia University. "It's an uphill climb. The U.S. courts have so far not wanted to set climate policy."

Other experts say it's unclear how a state can combat a global problem.

In Seattle, eight activists between ages 10 and 15 petitioned Washington state last year to adopt stricter science-based regulations to protect them against climate change. The case has been moving through a state court, and oral arguments are scheduled Tuesday.

"We're the ones who have to live with it if the oceans are acidic and the planet is 5 degrees warmer," said Gabriel Mandell, 13, an eighth-grader and plaintiff in the case. "The snowpack is melting. Ocean is acidifying. The Earth is warming. Everything that can go wrong is going wrong, and we need to fix it."

Mandell and other youths represented by the Western Environmental Law Center argue that Washington state has failed to reduce carbon emissions based on the best available science. They say the government has violated its duties under the state constitution and the legal principle called the public trust doctrine, which requires the government to protect shared resources.

Kocer said he was on hand this year during Johnny Cueto's complete game in Game Two, which saw the Royals beat the Mets 7-1.

"(We) went to Game Two of the World Series," he said. "What was so neat was when they were ahead and everybody's high-fiving after every run they scored."

The news of a second world championship was met with excitement amongst other local Royals fans, such as Scott Kooistra of KYNT.

"Thirty years ago on the last Sunday of October was when the Royals won their last World Series championship," Kooistra said. "And here you are, 30 years later, on a Sunday they do it again. Didn't know if it would ever happen again in my lifetime."

While the 2014 team almost seemed to effortlessly make their way through the playoffs, sweeping each round up to the World Series, the 2015 team had to fight back on a number of occasions — and this stuck out to Kooistra.

"I think what I was most impressed about was, seven times in the playoffs, to come from at least two runs behind, that's an all-time record," he said. "It shows

you the determination of that young group of guys. ... To me, it was a great team effort all the way up and down the lineup. I think it showcased what the Royals do on a baseball field — good contact, timely hitting, solid pitching, excellent bullpen, strong defense and exciting base running. I thought they just excelled in all of those."

Kocer said his family followed intently along when the series shifted to New York City, some even hoping the Series might go on just a little bit longer.

"My wife and three kids and spouses and even the grandchildren are big Royals fans," he said. "They watched all the games on TV. Some of them were hoping that it would come back to Kansas City, but I saw what the tickets were going to be costing for Game Six, so I'm kind of relieved they won it in New York."

Despite projections that Game Six tickets would've started at more than \$700, Kocer said the family still would've made the attempt to go had it happened.

Kooistra wasn't afraid to confess that, due to the late nature of some of this year's games, he may have missed some of the action.

"I'll admit, those 14- and 12-inning games, I dozed off a little bit, but kept watching," he said. "Let's face it — those were late games for a guy who wakes up at 4 a.m."
