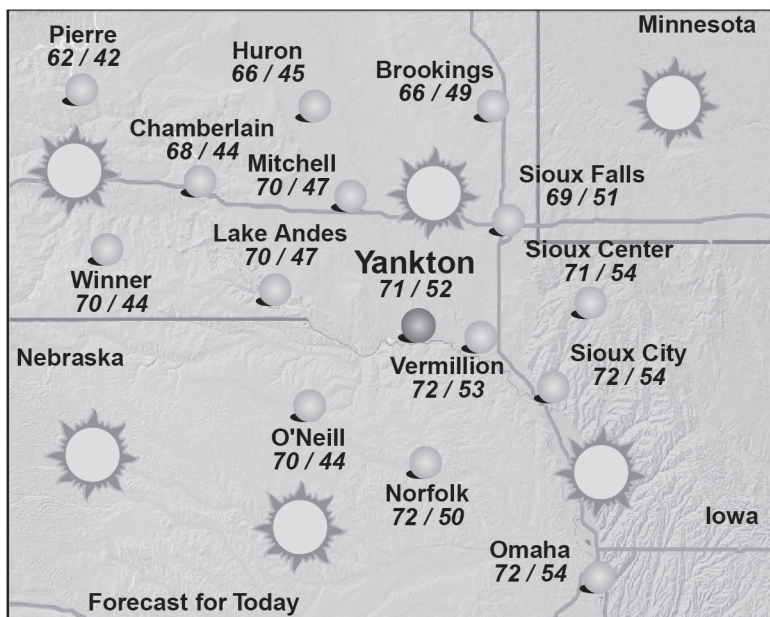

The Yankton Toys for Kids wish list is being compiled for children in need, under the age of 18, who live in Yankton County. A release form and a wish list are to be completed and returned to United Way by Nov. 13. Forms are available through Head Start, County Health Office, Contact Center, Lewis & Clark

Behavioral Health, S.D. Department of Labor, and Department of Social Services. An agency referral is required to qualify for the Yankton Toys for Kids program.
