Stocks had a mixed reaction Friday to the surprisingly strong October jobs report as investors adjusted to the prospect of higher interest rates as early as next month.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 46.90 points, or 0.3 percent, to 17,910.33.
The Standard & Poor's 500 index fell 0.73 points, or 0.03 percent, to 2,099.20.
The Nasdaq composite index rose 19.38 points, or 0.4 percent, to 5,127.12.

The S&P 500 was up 19.84 points, or 1 percent.

Wheat for December delivery was off 3 cents to \$5.2325 a bushel; December corn was lost 1.50 cents to 3.73 a bushel; December oats were fell .75 cent to 2.2375 a bushel; while January soybeans were gained 3.25 cents to \$8.6725 bushel.
Beef mixed and pork was lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was up .52 cent to \$1.3492 a pound; January feeder cattle fell .65 cent to \$1.7202 a pound; while December lean hogs lost .40 cent at \$5.5 a pound.
