his recruiting: USD is winning battles with other Summit League teams for certain players – such as Triston Simpson, a guard out of Lincoln, Nebraska, who will sign this week.

That's the winning culture Smith likes to talk about. "Culture is a word he brings up a lot," senior Casey Kasperbauer said. "It's a huge thing."

Another term Smith brought with him? G.A.T.A. What is G.A.T.A? Get After Their (Butts) – I'm substituting the obvious fourth word, but you get the idea. It's more than a throwaway term from a coach, it's a mindset. And it's one Smith brought – or borrowed, whatever you want to call it – with him from Miles.

"I had never heard of that before," Robertson said, smiling. "But all of a sudden it's so ingrained in what we do and who we are."

In discernible ways, the G.A.T.A style is a hard-nosed, physical, diving-on-the-floor, going after every rebound kind of style.

No doubt that mindset played a role in many of USD's win last season. Take a lot at their schedule from last season and you'll see wins by scores of 68-66, 55-53 and 64-62. And also, remember that Tyler Larson – who was all of 6-foot-3 – led the Summit League in rebounding (7.8). That's G.A.T.A. ball. "We've embraced that

mentality," Kasperbauer said. "We're not going to be the most talented team, or the fastest team, or anything like that, but I think we can be the toughest team."

And yes, sometimes the tougher team wins.

There are going to be nights when USD struggles from the field – we saw that in the Summit League tournament semifinals last season against SDSU – but more often than not, that winning style Smith always talks about will keep the Coyotes around.

"It might be something different every night," Smith said. "But one thing you know you can hang your hat on is the GATA mentality."

I asked a couple players during Monday's event if they felt the talk of reaching the NCAA Tournament seemed more realistic now than it did a year ago. I would imagine it would, right?

It wasn't some far off level the Coyotes would never reach. Not anymore. Not after last season when the program won a game in the postseason tournament.

"That's the beauty of college basketball," Smith said, smiling. "It's a chip and a chair."

(I had to Google that phrase. Apparently it's a poker reference?)

There had perhaps been a sense over in Vermillion that because the Summit League is right now a one-bid league, the need to win the conference tournament seemed daunting. The reality is, you simply need to play well at the right time.

## USSF Suggests No Headers For Players 10 And Under

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — The U.S. Soccer Federation is recommending a ban on headers for players 10 and under, limits for players between 11 and 13 and having medical professionals rather than coaches make decisions on whether players suspected of concussions can remain in games.

As part of an announcement that a lawsuit over concussions filed last year had been settled, the USSF said Monday it is implementing the changes for U.S. youth national teams and its development academy, which are controlled by the governing body. The USSF is strongly urging they be adopted by all of its members, which includes youth local level entities and American professional leagues not under direct authority of the defendants in the lawsuit.

U.S. youth national teams still will be bound by substitution rules of the events in which they participate, including those of FIFA and CONCACAF.

Under the new rules, a Health Care Professional (HCP) must be present at all development academy matches and will make all decisions regarding head injuries, taking decisions away from coaches. The replacement for a player who leaves a game for a suspected concussion or head injury will not count against a team's total for allowed substitutions. If the injured player is cleared to return by the HCP, he or she must replace the original substitute.

A group of youth players and parents sued in August 2014 in U.S. District Court in San Francisco, naming FIFA and the USSF as defendants along with the U.S. Youth Soccer Association, American Youth Soccer Organization, US Club Soccer and the California Youth Soccer Association.

U.S. District Judge Phyllis J. Hamilton dismissed the case against FIFA in July, and the USSF and lawyers for the plaintiffs announced a settlement Monday, when the rest of the suit was dismissed.

The USSF said within 30 days it will announce an initiative to improve concussion awareness, return-to-play protocols and substitution rules. The USSF said it had been developing a player safety campaign before the lawsuit.

**Illinois Fires AD Thomas**

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (AP) — Illinois fired athletic director Mike Thomas on Monday, saying he had done nothing wrong but a change was needed after the department was plunged into crisis when football and women's basketball players said had been mistreated by their coaches.

Thomas, who will be paid \$2.5 million to buy out the remainder of his contract, said he believes he acted appropriately but accepts the decision.

"I believe it is a good time to turn the page and put the focus of this organization back on the success and welfare of our student-athletes," Thomas said in a prepared statement.

Thomas is the latest high-profile leader to be swept aside in the turmoil at the university's flagship campus this year, following the resignation of one of his top backers, chancellor Phyllis Wise, and the August firing of football coach Tim Beckman.

"When you get to the conference tournament, all you have to do is win three games," Smith said. "Now, that's easy to say, but that's all you have to do."

"Go on a three-game winning streak and anything can happen."

What we've already started to see happen is Smith is building the program with a big-picture focus. He and his staff brought in four transfers after last season, and only one (Shy McClelland) is eligible this season.

The other three transfers, Matt Mooney (Air Force), Trey Dickerson (Iowa) and Carlton Hurst (Colorado State) will be the foundations for the future, along with three freshmen this season and the 2016 recruiting class.

Starting with what he did last season and what he's setting up for the future, Smith is slowly but surely rising USD's regional profile. Success is going to have to be part of the discussion. That's why he was hired. That's why USD opened the checkbooks to land him.

The question now is, what can Smith and Co. do for an encore this season? Is the next step in progression to reach the Summit League championship game?

Working in the Coyotes favor is the lack of a learning curve under the new staff.

"Now we have even more pieces in place and a coaching staff that knows us better," Kasperbauer said, so I think the bar is going to be set even higher."


