MARSY'S LAW

Backers of the Marsy's Law ballot measure want to expand the rights of crime victims during court proceedings and criminal trials and enshrine those rights in the South Dakota Constitu-

For example, the proposal guarantees that a victim can be present in court and ensures victims are heard in all stages of criminal proceedings including plea agreements, which otherwise might be offered without their consultation.

REDISTRICTING COMMISSION

The proposal would amend the state constitution so that a commission redraws the state's legislative districts. Currently, the Legislature redraws the boundaries of legislative districts every decade to reflect population changes reported by the census.

The proposal would create a commission made up of nine registered voters selected each redistricting year. No more than three commission members could be part of the same political

PAYDAY LENDING CAP

The measure would limit interest rates from money lenders licensed in South Dakota to 36 percent annually. Supporters say the proposal is aimed at protecting consumers from predatory

PAYDAY LENDING AMENDMENT

The constitutional amendment would cap loan interest rates at 18 percent annually unless the borrower agreed to a higher rate in writing. It also says no law capping interest rates is valid unless the borrower can agree to a different rate.

ANTI-CORRUPTION PACKAGE

The measure would create a state ethics commission, require additional campaign finance disclosure and limit lobbying by state officials and high-level employees after they leave government. It also would create a publicly funded campaign finance program.

NONPARTISAN ELECTIONS

The constitutional amendment would establish nonpartisan elections in South Dakota. Candidates would not be identified by party affiliation on either the primary or general election ballot. It would not apply to elections for U.S. president.

RIGHT TO CHARGE FEES

The labor union-backed measure would give corporate or non-profit organizations the right to charge fees in right-to-work South Dakota. Supporters of the proposal say unions shouldn't have to provide services such as contract negotiations or representation during the grievance process

MEDICAL MARIJUANA

The proposal would allow patients with a physician's recommendation to purchase or cultivate marijuana and possess up to 3 ounces of the plant. The measure is aimed at patients with debilitating medical conditions.

6.9-Magnitude Quake Hits Off Chile; No Damage Reported

SANTIAGO, Chile (AP) — A strong earthquake has struck in the Pacific off central Chile, but authorities say there are no reports of injuries or serious damage.

The U.S. Geological Survey says the quake had a preliminary magnitude of 6.9 Tuesday night. It says the epicenter was about 54 miles (88 kilometers) northwest of the coastal city of Coquimbo at a depth of 6 miles (10 kilometers).
