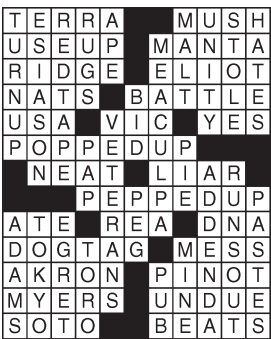

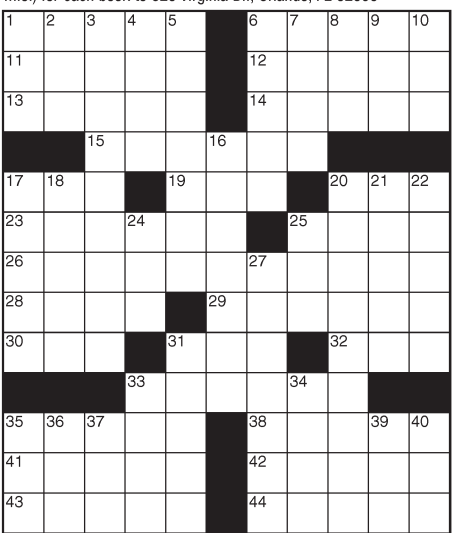

moving to a commercial company.

"We left Vermillion in many respects out of necessity," Behring said. "From there, the question was what next. Her post-doctorate work took us to Los Angeles.
