USD takes special pride in hosting the high school football finals for the entire 35year playoff history, according to USD athletic director David Herbster.

"We have always viewed this as an opportunity to showcase USD and Vermillion to the state," he said. "Regardless of the outcome of the games, we want people leaving campus saying, 'Wow! This is a place I could see myself.' Whether that be moving here or attending school at USD, we look at this as our first opportunity to leave an impression on people."

Herbster said his staff, other workers and volunteers are ready to host the gridiron marathon – including their huge rivalry game with SDSU.

"We have done this before and understand it is an allhands-on-deck mentality," he said. "All the coaches and staff know that this may be the only time some of these people will ever step foot in the Dome, and we want to make sure they have a first-class experience."

Team players won't be found only on the football squads, Herbster said. USD officials need a unified effort to roll out the red carpet for visitors, he said.

"Eight games in three days is no easy task and can only be accomplished with a dedicated staff that has an incredible (professional) attitude," he said.

This year's effort becomes more challenging with construction work still under way on the new fieldhouse next to the DakotaDome. USD officials have made accommodations for parking, tailgating and other activities.

"We've been able to add field parking west of the Dome which gives us more room than we had prior to construction. We've implemented a better organized and structured parking system this year for football that we're confident will enhance our efforts over this weekend," Herbster said.

"The key here is to having bodies in the parking lots directing traffic, answering questions and troubleshooting

"Before, we would rely on sales to come from the schools during the week and at the door on Game Day," he said. "Now, if schools sell out of their allotment, they can point their fans online to purchase tickets without having to worry if their session is sold out."

For South Dakotans, football is more than a game, he said. The game nights become social events, particularly with the end of harvest, he said.
