

WALL ST. RECAP

The market slumped to its second-biggest weekly loss of the year Friday, breaking six consecutive weeks of gains. Fears that the holiday shopping season will be a dud tanked retail stocks.

FOR FRIDAY:

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 202.83 points, or 1.2 percent, to 17,245.24.
The Standard & Poor's 500 index gave up 22.93 points, or 1.1 percent, to 2,023.04.
The Nasdaq composite index slipped 77.20 points, or 1.5 percent, to 4,927.88.

* No four-way stop signs will be placed at the intersections of Douglas Street with Eighth and 15th streets in the near future. The Yankton City Commission voted 7-1 Tuesday to keep the intersections clear of the four-way stops. Commissioner Ron Tappe was the only dissenting vote.
* A plan to give tax refunds to low-income South Dakotans was approved Tuesday by a commission of state lawmakers studying tax reform, but the panel delayed a decision on how to pay for the refunds.

Wheat for December delivery fell 2.25 cents to \$4.9575 a bushel; December corn was off 3.75 cents to 3.5825 a bushel; December oats were up 1.50 cents to 2.3150 a bushel; while January soybeans were declined 7.75 cents

to \$8.5525 bushel.
Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was off 2.48 cents to \$1.3067 a pound; January feeder cattle fell 2.35 cents to \$1.6455 a pound; while December lean hogs lost 1.30 cents to \$5.480 a pound.


