INDIANAPOLIS—South Dakota senior Amber Eichkorn qualified for the NCAA Cross Country Championships for the second consecutive season,

as announced by the NCAA on Saturday.

Eichkorn placed eighth at the NCAA Midwest
Regional in Lawrence, Kan., Friday with a time of 20:32.9. Eichkorn was the fourth individual not on a qualifying team and receives an automatic individual qualifying spot.
