"We are very excited that Sydney has decided to join our golf program," VanDamme said. "Sydney is one of the most impressive recruits I have ever met. Her commitment to comprehensive excellence is exactly what we are looking for."

Bormann is a three-time South Dakota Class A State individual medalist and four-time South Dakota Class A All-Tournament selection from Parkston High School. The four-year letterwinner helped the Trojans to their fourth-consecutive state title this past season.

The Parkston, native won the 2014, 2013 and 2011 individual state titles and finished third in 2012.

"Sydney's junior career has been exceptional which allowed her numerous recruiting possibilities and we are very excited she chose to be a Jackrabbit," VanDamme said.

Bormann is a two-time South Dakota Golf Association Junior Female Golfer of the Year. She was the 2015 SDGA Women's Amateur Championship runner-up and the 2013 SDGA Women's Match Play runner-up.

A two-time Midwest Junior Championship individual medalist (2015 and 2013), Bormann was the 2015 Pepsi Little People's Golf Championship individual medalist. She also competed in three Trusted Choice Big 1 National Championships.

Bormann has two American Junior Golf Association top-10 finishes, six Future Collegians World Tour top-five finishes and four Rocky Mountain Junior Golf Tour wins.

Five Area Athletes Earn All-GPAC Honors

SIOUX CITY, IOWA — Four student-athletes from the region earned second-team honors as the Great Plains Athletic Conference announced its all-league team for football on Tuesday.

Another earned honorable mention recognition. Dakota Wesleyan's Dustin Livingston, a junior from Irene, earned second-team honors as a punt returner and honorable mention recognition as a receiver. Livingston returned 17 punts, averaging 11.7 per attempt, with one return for touchdown. He also averaged 17.8 yards per kickoff return. As a receiver, he had 51 catches for 778 yards and eight touchdowns, ranking second on the Tigers in all three categories.

Morningside running back Weslee Dvorak, a freshman from Parkston, rushed for 663 yards and five touchdowns, and caught eight passes for 163 yards and two touchdowns for the Mustangs.

Briar Cliff running back Mitch Heikes, a senior from Laurel, Nebraska, rushed for a team-high 873 yards and four touchdowns, and caught 16 passes for 120 yards.

DWU's Sam Kiger, a senior defensive line-

man from Irene, recorded 51 tackles, including nine for loss and 3.5 sacks. He also recorded an interception on the season.

Doane's Holden Wetzel, a senior receiver from Creighton, Nebraska, earned honorable mention recognition. He caught just seven balls for 97 yards, but took four of them in for touchdowns.

The GPAC qualified two teams for the NAIA playoffs, top-ranked Morningside (10-1) and ninth-ranked Doane (9-1). DWU (9-2), ranked 14th, was the highest-ranked team not to qualify for post-season play.

USF Football's St. Pierre Named NSIC Defensive Player Of The Week

BURNSVILLE, MINN. — After recording his 22nd career interception on Saturday, senior cornerback Solomon St. Pierre of the #16/17 University of Sioux Falls Football Team (9-2) was named the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference Defensive Player of the Week, according to an announcement by the league today.

St. Pierre, a criminal justice major from Wagner, S.D., earned his third NSIC honor of his career. In a 69-20 win over Upper Iowa on the road Saturday, St. Pierre had his league-leading ninth interception, which ranks fourth in NCAA DII, and added four tackles, a TFL and a forced fumble. In the first quarter, his interception and 24-yard TD return helped USF build a 21-0 lead en route to the Cougars' ninth victory of the season.

His interception was one of seven registered by the USF defense, which leads the league and ranks 11th nationally in turnover margin (1.27 per game). In fact, the TD return was St. Pierre's third of the season and sixth for his career, another USF school record. He also pushed his career interception return yardage to 518, also a school mark, and one of the best totals in NSIC history.

He is the only current player in NCAA DII with at least nine interceptions in back-to-back years. The interception against Upper Iowa set the USF school record for career interceptions at 22 and is the most career picks in the NSIC since Jack Moro (SCSU) had 21.
