MMC Education Students Work To Reinvent America's School System

MMC's Integrated Technology Class is participating in the XQ Super School Project competition by contributing

ideas to improve America's school system.

Mount Marty Education students are taking part in a national competition to create the new model for America's high schools. Instructor Dr. Candice Climer is leading her Integrated Technology class through XQ's Super School Project competition, with the winning ideas being awarded \$50 million to make their ideas a reality.

The Super School Project is a national call for ideas on how to redesign and improve America's school system. The challenge opened on September 11 and the Mount Marty team submitted their idea on the xqsuperschool. org website on November 9. Now, the 12 students are actively seeking feedback from different communities and schools as they will take all this information to submit their final design in February

"This was a great opportunity to bring real life problem solving and critical thinking into the classroom," said Climer. "These students are changing terminology used in the current school systems and rethinking everything from the layout, polices, extracurricular activities and process that the students take throughout high school. We are building a concept that reaches out to our current generation of students and preparing them for their future by applying their concepts that are taught and using higher level

thinking skills. The Integrating Technology class has named their project Eximius Ouest (XO). The concept will transform the learning atmosphere with student centered learning

through the guidance of teachers and administrators to allow students to reach their full potential. The concept will provide students with elective logos in conjunction with prerequisite logos and diverse opportunities needed for individual personal achievement. This will be offered to students with exploratory and discovery learning through real world application.

All the elements of their school will come together in a powerful learning experience for students by:

1. Community being developed through the intrapersonal relationships of students, staff and administration

2. Experiences in a diverse range of fields being gained through exploratory and prerequisite logos

3. Ownership being created through an investment of pride in school, education and community

4. Innovativeness gained though modern concepts of technology and hands on learning with access to the latest devices

5. Commitment, dedication and teamwork through the participation of extracurricular activities

After the final ideas and designs are submitted in February, national semi-finalists will be announced in March. Finalists will be chosen in April and the winners announced in August 2016.
