Classic Ballet Presented At Summit Center This Weekend

For three cast members, there's no rest for "Sleeping Beauty."

The teens – Rachel Frick, Elle Hiltunen and Samantha Kanaly – are rotating the lead role of Princess Aurora and the supporting roles of the Bluebird and as a dancer in waltz scenes. In addition, McKenna Golden dances the other lead as the Lilac Fairy. The production features 16 solos.

The Academy of Dance in Yankton is performing the classic story this weekend at the Yankton High School theatre. The shows are set for 2 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday. Director Dorota Dan-

Director Dorota Dannenbring brings her unique dance talents and background to the performance. She was trained as a professional dancer in her native Poland, and she now owns and teaches at the Academy of Dance. The 130 cast members in "Sleeping Beauty" range in age from first grade through adult.

"I love Yankton, and I enjoy working with so many talented people," she said.

Dannenbring decided the three-dancer rotation would showcase a number of girls and their various talents. However, she didn't hold any particular dancers in mind when she went with the multiple roles.

"I didn't recruit anyone. I stayed away from selecting the dancers," she said. "All of the dancers needed to apply for the production. For the au-

ditions, we hired professional judges. We had three judges who held the tryouts. They did it right after Riverboat Days (in August), and they selected the dancers for all of the roles."

That said, the three dancers rotating the lead roles said they love "Sleeping Beauty" and enjoy sharing the spotlight. They drew to see who performed the roles at a particular performance.

Dancing is nothing new for the trio, as they each started at age 3.

Frick performed in the "Nutcracker Suite" last year and a different role in "Sleeping Beauty" two years ago. "I started performing in first grade, but this is the first year that I have been in the

Kanaly expressed a similar passion for ballet. "I have danced all my life. I especially love to dance as Aurora," she said.

Golden has found the production to be challenging, and it has filled her with nervous energy. However, she enjoys the bond which has developed among the dancers after the three months of rehearsals. "I consider it a blessing to dance with my friends. We encourage each other," she said.

Dannenbring said she hasn't found difficulty casting boys for roles. The males include 10 younger boys and five Yankton High School students. The YHS boys include Syd Boots, Jared Rafferty, Blake Savey, Gabe Dannenbring and Josh Galvan-Hofer.

The five high school boys represent a mix of dance experience. Some have performed before, including the "Nutcracker," while others are


