

Cedar County Crash Claims One Life

LAUREL, Neb. — A South Sioux City, Neb., man has died following a two-vehicle crash in Cedar County, Neb. Aaron M. Surber, 25, died in the Thursday evening accident on Nebraska Highway 15 south of Laurel, Neb., according to the Cedar County Sheriff Larry Koranda. The accident occurred around 7 p.m. Thursday 3.5 miles south of Laurel near mile marker 176, Koranda said in a news release.

Surber was northbound on Highway 15, driving a 2005 Jeep Liberty. The Jeep Liberty crossed the center line, over-corrected, crossed the center line again and struck a southbound 2005 Chevrolet Silverado pickup. Tyler Vrba, 23, of Laurel, was driving the pickup. After the collision, the Jeep Liberty rolled multiple times and came to rest in a cornfield. Kelly Konecko, 33, of Omaha was a passenger in the Jeep Liberty. She was transported to Providence Medical Center

in Wayne, Neb., with minor injuries. Konecko and Vrba were wearing seatbelts at the time of the accident. Surber was not wearing a seat belt and was ejected from the vehicle. He was pronounced dead at the scene. Assisting at the scene was the Laurel Volunteer Fire and Ambulance, the Coleridge (Neb.) Police Department and the Laurel Police Department. The accident remains under investigation, Koranda said in a news release. Follow @RDockendorf on Twitter.

The stock market closed out its best week of the year Friday as big gains by retailers and technology companies pushed major indexes higher.

FOR FRIDAY:
The Dow Jones industrial average picked up 91.06 points, or 0.5 percent, to 17,823.81.
The S&P 500 index added 7.93 points, or 0.4 percent, to 2,089.17.
The Nasdaq composite index rose 31.28 points, or 0.6 percent, to 5,104.92.

FOR THE WEEK:
The Dow gained 578.57 points, or 3.4 percent.
The S&P advanced 66.13 points, or 3.3 percent.
The Nasdaq climbed 177.04 points, or 3.6 percent.

FOR THE YEAR:
The Dow is up 0.74 points, less than 0.1 percent.
The S&P is up 30.27 points, or 1.5 percent.
The Nasdaq is up 368.86 points, or 7.8 percent.

Wheat for March delivery fell 2.25 cents to \$4.90 a bushel; March corn was off .50 cent to 3.6975 a bushel; March oats was gained 2.25 cents to 2.3225 a bushel; while January soybeans declined

2.50 cents to \$8.5750 bushel. Beef was mixed and pork was higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. February live cattle was off .03 cent to \$1.3202 a pound; January feeder cattle rose 1.65 cents to \$1.6410 a pound; while February lean hogs rose 1.60 cents to \$5.832 a pound.
