YPD Offering Citizens Academy In 2016

The Yankton Police Department is now accepting applications for the third annual session of its Police Citizens Academy which will start Feb. 23, 2016.

This is a 12-week program that gives citizens first-hand information on how and why the department operates, and examines the culture of police work and the organization. It provides an excellent opportunity for the citizens to interact with department members and see the realities of law enforcement.

The students meet every Tuesday evening from 6-8 p.m. The program involves both classroom and interactive instruction.

The Citizens' Academy is not an offer of employment, but a volunteer program to educate those members of the community who want to hear information on law enforcement right from the source. This program is intended to open the lines of communication between police and our community. By allowing citizens a firsthand look at what rules, regulations and policies the police follow, some of the misunderstanding may be alleviated. In addition, YPD officials are building "community partners" that help us to further enhance the effectiveness and safety of the community.

Participants take part in a variety of demonstrations and presentations. Class members are also offered the opportunity to ride along with the patrol officers to see police work first-hand.

- Classes may include:
- Community Service Programs, School Resource Officer, and budgets;
 - 911 Communications and patrol procedures;
 - Yankton County Sheriff's Office and jail tour;
 - Traffic Stops, crash investigation and forensic reconstruction;
 - Narcotics, YPD training curriculum, K9;
 - Special Response Team demonstration, firearms, Crisis Negotiations Team;
 - Firearms simulation training, Critical Incident Stress Management, and Active Shooter Response;
 - Practical Exercise where "citizens" respond and handle a mock-up crime scene.
- If you are interested in attending the Yankton Police Department Citizens' Police Academy, complete the application on the City of Yankton website and your name will be placed on the list. The academy will be held at the Yankton Public Safety Center at 410 Walnut Street, Yankton.

South Dakota Shakespeare Festival Announces Upcoming Production

VERMILLION — The South Dakota Shakespeare Festival (SDSF) has announced it will present present Shakespeare's "The Winter's Tale" June 9-12 in Vermillion's Prentis Park.

"The Winter's Tale," a late Shakespeare play, features elements of heart-wrenching drama, pastoral comedy, and giddy romance. The production will feature an all-star artistic team of seasoned professionals hired from competitive national and regional markets, combined with younger professionals drawn from USD's Theatre program.

The South Dakota Shakespeare Festival (SDSF) is a professional, non-profit theatre company that is supported in collaboration with USD's College of Fine Arts and Department of Theatre, and produced by Coyoteo-

poly, an interdisciplinary service-learning company designed and operated by students to reinforce classroom learning in USD's Beacom School of Business.

The mission of the South Dakota Shakespeare Festival is to increase the cultural, artistic and educational offerings of the state of South Dakota and surrounding regions through professional Shakespeare performances and arts education events delivered in a lively and accessible format. Under the leadership of Artistic Director Chaya Gordon-Bland, Executive Director Greg Huckabee and Production Manager Scott Mollman, the South Dakota Shakespeare Festival seeks to fulfill an important cultural and educational need throughout the state and Great Plains Region.

On Nov. 23-24, in collaboration with USD Theatre, the South Dakota Shakespeare Festival is sending a tour of Shakespeare performances to high schools throughout the state. The touring group will travel to Wagner High School, Flandreau High School and the Flandreau Indian School. The tour is supported with a grant from USD's Center for Academic and Global Engagement (CAGE), matched by funds from USD Theatre, Coyoteo-

poly and the United Way of Vermillion. "Wine with Will," the annual fundraiser for the South Dakota Shakespeare Festival, will be held on Feb. 12, 2016, at the John Day Gallery in the Warren M. Lee Center for Fine Arts, during the Stillwell Exhibition. All proceeds from this event directly support

production of the South Dakota Shakespeare Festival's 2016 season.
