Waverly-South Shore senior center Austin Buchholz: A two-time All-East Central Conference selection, Buchholz called the adjustments at the line for running and passing plays for the Coyotes, who made a run to the 9A semifinals.

Canistota senior defensive end Jonathan Dick: A versatile player, Dick was the leading tackler on defense with 47 tackles and two forced fumbles. He was a key cog in the Hawks' run defense, which allowed 2.4 yards per carry. Scotland senior defensive end Kreg Keppinger: Coach Ryan Robb said Keppinger has a "motor that doesn't stop." He had seven sacks and 73.5 tackles for the season, along with 10 tackles for loss, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and two blocked punts. He tallied 122 tackles and 12 sacks for his career. Canistota senior linebacker Drew Seubert: The heart of the Hawks' defense that allowed 6.5 points per game and pitched seven shutouts, Seubert had 87 tackles, three sacks, three interceptions and had 17.5 tackles for a loss. Potter County junior linebacker Jacob Rausch: A linebacker who loves to hit, Rausch had 97 solo tackles and 28 assists, along with two sacks for the

Scotland senior linebacker Tanner Iwan: With a nose for the ball, Iwan had four forced fumbles and four recoveries. He finished the 2015 season with 89.5 tackles, three sacks and an interception. He finishes his career with 149.5 tackles, six sacks and four interceptions for the Highlanders. Gayville-Volin junior linebacker Grant Rice: A two-time all-Great Plains pick, Rice had 65 tackles, three interceptions and a defensive touchdown. He has 184 tackles, eight sacks and five interceptions for his career. Canistota senior defensive back Shay Jolley: A three-time all-Cornbelt Conference selection and a heavy hitter in the secondary, Jolley had six

- interceptions, broke-up 29 passes and made 32 tackles for the state champion Hawks. Menno/Marion senior defensive back Jackson Diede: For the Razorbacks in 2015, Diede had 62 tackles and three sacks, along with an interception and seven pass break-ups. He racked up 105 tackles, nine interceptions and six forced fumbles for his career. Warner sophomore kicker Danzan Gilborne: Gilborne provided a threat for Warner on special teams, averaging nearly 45 yards per kickoff and making 21 extra points. He was 2 for 2 on field goals this season, with a long of 40 yards.

- Lemmon/Mcintosh junior punter Preston Baumgarten: Averaging 31.3 yards per punt, Baumgarten did well to angle the ball and change field position for the Cowboys. Warner senior long snapper Bryce Fisher: For the last three years, Fisher grew without a bad snap on field goals and punts, providing a sense of security for the Monarchs' kicking game.
