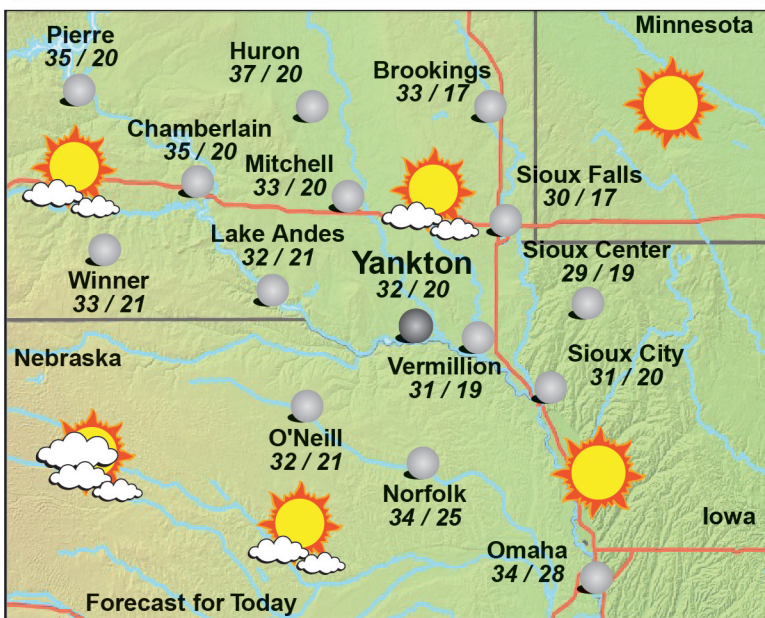

Dakota Hospital Farewell And Tree Of Lights Open House

VERMILLION — Dakota Hospital Foundation and Sanford Vermillion are hosting a Farewell Ceremony for the historic Dakota Hospital building and celebrating the future of health care in our community with our annual Tree of Lights event at Sanford Vermillion on Tuesday, Dec. 1, from 5-7 p.m. All are encouraged to come celebrate and remember, join in the fellowship and enjoy hors d'oeuvres and refreshments.

The Tree of Lights program provides community members with the opportunity to purchase a light in memory of, in honor of or as special holiday greetings to friends, co-workers or loved ones. The 9-1/2 foot Christmas tree located in the Main Lobby at Sanford Vermillion has been designated for the touching display.

With the excitement of the \$14.2 million facility upgrade in progress at Sanford Vermillion, comes too, the time to bid farewell to the historic 3-story original Dakota Hospital building. The project, initiated in May of this year, is approaching the close of phase one which includes new construction on the east side of the medical center campus. New facilities near completion include a drive-through ambulance bay and upgrades in the hospital emergency department as well as new, centrally located, pharmacy and laundry facilities; both previously housed in the original hospital building.

Phase two will involve separation and demolition of the original building and phase three is expected to begin in the summer of 2016. The project will renovate 10,634 square feet of the current space and will add approximately 17,276 square feet of new construction.

A state-of-the-art outpatient facility with centralized registration and expansion

at Sanford Clinic Vermillion will round out the remainder of the construction project.

"The Farewell Ceremony, along with plans for a sculpture and video to memorialize personal experiences, sacrifices and community contributions, is a time for all of us to remember fondly the many life events that have taken place over the past 80 years. It was 85 years ago when the health care pioneers of our community perceived a need for a local hospital staffed by professional health care workers and changed the health care landscape in Vermillion. We need to remember those efforts and carry on the tradition of excellence in providing the Vermillion area the finest "The Dakota Hospital Foundation board of directors is, of course, very excited about all the upcoming improvements and upgrades happening on the medical center campus. It's been a project that we knew was crucial for the community to move forward. With the changes, we also want to make a special effort to reflect and recognize the people (and structure) that served so importantly in the care and lives of so many of our community," said Kevin Myron, president, Dakota Hospital Foundation.

"We have been so pleased to have so many people share their memories and stories related to the old Dakota Hospital. I look forward to the additional stories we will hear at the farewell and celebration ceremony! I hope everyone takes this opportunity to come and share their memories with us," concluded Myron.

Rentals can be picked up beginning at noon on Friday, Dec. 4. The organizers would like to have as much participation as possible this year and feel providing the displays would make the effort simple to entrants.

There is no entry fee for participation, but if you would like to rent a display, a donation is being asked.

The parade route will go north on Capital, turning west onto Third Street, south on Cedar and east on Second Street and end at the Gurney Landing large building on Second & Capital. Parade winners will be announced at the end of the parade. First place winners in Commercial, Non-profit & Individual will receive \$50 in Chamber Dollars and second place will receive \$50 gift certificates from the Twist of Pine.

Free hot chocolate will be served. Retailers in the House of Gurney Historic District, including Twist of Pine (in the former Gurney Gas Station) and L. Stocks finished mostly higher Friday at the end of a quiet, holiday-shortened week of trading. Telecommunications and financial stocks rose, while oil prices slumped, dragging down energy stocks.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index picked up 1.24 points, or less than 0.1 percent, to 2,090.11.
The Nasdaq composite index added 11.38 points, or 0.2 percent, to 5,127.52.
