


South Dakota has been invaluable to our relationship with L&M Radiator," said Mike Dellinger, president of YAPG. "YAPG and Yankton are fortunate that we can count on the Governor's Office of Economic Development and other state resources to help our corporate citizens capitalize and create jobs. We're very pleased that Lt. Gov. Daugaard will lead the celebration, because he participated in the ribbon cutting when L&M Radiator began production in Yankton a few years ago. This is a great step forward as we support the company and its workforce in our community.

Tony Carey, the Yankton plant manager for L&M Radiator, spoke at a YAPG meeting in August about the increase in orders his facility was experiencing

"It's picking up and looks like it's staying there," he said at the time. "We've had a very big increase in employees. We've grown three times what we had a year ago — from 17 to 50. And we're still looking at hiring more.' A partnership with

Caterpillar, the world's leading manufacturer of construction and mining equipment, has led to much of that success. Carey said in August that the 30-40

radiators the Yankton plant was then building for Caterpillar every month was about 50 percent of its workload, and there was the potential that it could grow.

Another Yankton company that announced plans earlier this year to build a new facility and expand its workforce by about 50 works closely with L&M Radiator. Dakota Trailer provides welding and other services for the radiator company, according to Dellinger. Increased business at L&M Radiator will likely translate into more work for Dakota Trailer, he said.

"(The expansion) will probably have an impact on the relationship L&M has with Dakota Trailer," Dellinger stat-

Between the two companies, approximately 100 jobs are expected to be created in the next several years.

"If you have 100 new manufacturing jobs in your community, you can typically expect 60 new service and retail positions in the local economy." Dellinger said. "This will stimulate the need for additional employment to support those major employers. That's coupled with the recent announcement of the city with regard to Menard's and that retail development. We're pretty well positioned to do the things we need to do to grow the local

economy. "We have job opportunities ahead, and that's important for our workforce," he added.


