Nebraska's 2nd District Candidates Court 'New' Voters

OMAHA, Neb. — Fall brings with it familiar weekend activities: football games, raking leaves, carving pumpkins. And for some 20,000 voters in western Sarpy County, it will also bring a knock on the door by U.S. House candidates.

Campaign officials for the three Republican candidates vying for the 2nd Congressional District seat in 2012 have sought voter roll information from the Sarpy County Election Commissioner's office with the intent to reach out to the district's "new" voters.

Since 2001, the 2nd District's boundaries have encompassed all of Douglas County, which includes Omaha, and most of the eastern half of Sarpy County. But earlier this year, following the 2010 U.S. Census, the Nebraska Legislature redrew the district's lines to shift Sarpy County's 2nd District area to the western two-thirds of Sarpy County, including Gretna, Springfield and the Chalco community south of Omaha.

Sarpy County voters who fall within the newly drawn 2nd District began getting visits from Rep. Lee Terry's campaign this weekend, and they will continue to every weekend through October before Terry holds a town hall meeting in Gretna on Nov. 4. His two Republican challengers — Omaha financial adviser Brett Lindstrom and mathematics professor Jack Heidel — say they plan to start going door-to-door within weeks.

"Brett realized early on how important the new voters were to the 2nd District and started making an impact early on" by scheduling speaking engagements and attending festivals and parades in the area, said Randi Scott, a campaign manager for Lindstrom.

"We are well aware of Congressman Terry's plan to do literature drops for four weeks and then follow that up with a town hall," Scott said. "But Brett has the advantage of being present for the next eight months and is personally meeting and listening to constituents basically every day."

But Terry has his advantages too — chief among them being that the "new" areas of the 2nd District aren't new to him. They were included in the 2nd District when Terry was first elected to Congress in 1998, only changing with redistricting in 2001.

"It's almost like homecoming," said Dave Boomer, Terry's campaign manager. "Lee obviously had that part of the district in his first two terms. Many of them remember him when he was their representative and have been following him."

Sarpy County Election Commissioner Wayne Bena said 2nd District candidates are working off of preliminary voter rolls in determining where to campaign, showing nearly 55,000 registered voters in the Sarpy County segment of the 2nd District, compared to 71,000 in the old eastern segment of the county. Of the new estimate, some 27,000 are Republicans, nearly 15,000 are Democrats, nearly 13,000 are independent and 66 are Libertarian.

New rolls for the district likely won't be finalized until the first of the year, Bena said.

But that's not deterring the candidates, who see a chance to start fresh with voters new to the district.

"I'll be starting door-to-door canvassing in Sarpy County within two weeks, at the latest," said Heidel, who has already been going door-to-door in west Omaha five nights a week for the past three weeks.

Terry's camp will be using the latest technology in its quest to connect with voters.

"Our kids will have iPads, and when they go to the door, they'll know the name of the voter and will ask them a few questions on issues," Boomer said. "They can input that in real time into the iPad, and it's immediately transmitted to the data system we have, so that we'll have a good profile of all the people that we reach."

Even the lone Democrat in the race — Douglas County Treasurer John Ewing — will be knocking on doors in Sarpy County this fall, despite the fact that he likely won't face opposition until after the May partisan primary decides his rival in the November 2012 general election. Ewing garnered his voter rolls from the state Democratic Party, he said.

"We're going to compete for every vote in Congressional District 2," Ewing said.

"I have to make sure that my child is healthy, and I do not want to put medications in my child that I think are going to harm them," said O'Neill, who was not involved in the survey appearing in Pediatrics.

O'Neill said she's not an extreme anti-vaccine zealot. She just thinks that parents — not doctors or schools — should make medical decisions for their children.

Study author Dr. Amanda Dempsey, a pediatrician and researcher at the University of Michigan, said vaccine skepticism is fueled by erroneous information online and media reports that sensationalize misconceptions. These include the persistent belief among some parents about an autism-vaccine link despite scientific evidence to the contrary and the debunking of one of the most publicized studies that first fueled vaccine fears years ago.

Some parents also dismiss the severity of vaccine-preventable diseases because they've never seen a child seriously ill with those illnesses.

But vaccine-preventable diseases including flu and whooping cough can be deadly, especially in infants, said Dr. Buddy Creech, associate director of Vanderbilt University's Vaccine Research Program. Creech has two school-aged children who are fully vaccinated and a newborn he said will be given all the recommended vaccinations.

"From being someone in the trenches seeing children die every year from influenza and its complications ... I would not do a single thing to risk the health of my kids," he said. Creech has served on advisory boards for vaccine makers and has accepted their research money.

Dempsey, the survey's lead author, has been a paid adviser to Merck on issues regarding a vaccine for older children but said that company made no contributions to the survey research.

Knowledge Networks conducted the survey, which had an error margin of plus or minus 5 percentage points. Dr. Larry Pickering, an infectious disease specialist at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, said the new survey is important and well done, and indicates that doctors need to do a better job of communicating vaccine information to patients.

Pickering said he supports the idea of parents being actively involved in medical care for their children, but cautioned: "If they're going to do that, they need to be fully informed about the risks and benefits of vaccines and need to obtain the information from a valid source."

The CDC, the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Academy of Family Physicians are among groups that provide online vaccine information based on medical research.

Ia. Religious Group To Protest At Base

OFFUTT AIR FORCE BASE, Neb. (AP) — A religious group from Iowa will lead a peace rally at Offutt Air Force Base.

The Sisters of St. Francis from Dubuque, Iowa, say Sunday afternoon's demonstration is meant to commemorate both the 10th anniversary of the war in Afghanistan and St. Francis of Assisi.

The group says it expects about 100 protesters from across Iowa to travel to eastern Nebraska for the protest. It anticipates some demonstrators will be arrested for trespassing.

Missing Woman With Dementia Found

WATERLOO, Iowa (AP) — A missing Waterloo woman with dementia has been found dead.

Waterloo police told the *Waterloo-Cedar Falls Courier* that the body of 81-year-old Patricia Bartels was found early Sunday morning. Details of her death were not immediately released.

Authorities had asked Saturday for the public's help in finding Bartels. She had left her home early Saturday morning to drive 50 miles to Manchester but never arrived at her destination. Police had said there was concern for her safety because of a recent diagnosis of dementia.

Business Asks City To Pay For Damage

NORTH PLATTE, Neb. (AP) — An auction company has filed a claim against the city of North Platte over water damage.

The North Platte Livestock Auction Company suffered more than \$100,000 in damages following a June rain-storm. The *North Platte Telegraph* reports that the company is asking the city to cover the costs because the damage came after the city built a dam blocking a drainage ditch south of its location.

The city council will consider the claim at its Tuesday meeting.

Volunteers Help With Flood Cleanup

PIERRE (AP) — More than 150 volunteers spent Saturday morning participating in cleanups on Pierre's parks and public lands.

KCCR radio reports that the work centered on parks and other recreational areas that were heavily damaged by this year's flooding.

Volunteers picked up debris, cleaned structures and continued the cleanup efforts already started by city crews.

City Parks and Recreation Division Director Tom Farnsworth says the volunteers donated man-hours equating to about \$15,000 in value.

Also on Saturday night, some 140 U.S. Air Force Academy cadets left town after working two full days on cleanup projects. They removed sandbags from homes north of Fort Pierre, in Pierre and Pierre's city parks and softball complex.
