IRENE — With a pair of rushers over 100 yards, the fourth-ranked Class 9A Irene-Wakonda Eagles continued their strong season with a 41-8 rout of Parker in high school football action Friday night in Irene.

Dustin Livingston rushed for 122 yards and two touchdowns, while Scott Davis ran for 100 yards and two scores. Livingston also completed a 30-yard touchdown pass to Brian Huth.

Huth scored the final touchdown of the night for Irene-Wakonda (7-0) on a 7-yard run in the fourth quarter.

Davis led the defense with 10 tackles.

For the visiting Pheasants (2-4), Seth Dykstra ran for 47 yards and Cedric Hay threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to Eric Hunstad in the second quarter. Nate Rasmussen made nine tackles on defense.
