Yankton Man Wins Age Division At World Triathlon

Gregory Taylor, a physician at Avera Sacred Heart Hospital in Yankton, won his age division at the Ironman World Championship triathlon, held last Saturday in Kailua-Kona, Hawaii.

Taylor, 57, finished first in the men's 55-59 division, with an overall time of 10:03.43. He recorded an overall finish of 48th out of a total of 1,918 athletes that competed.

The race consisted of a 2.4-mile swim, a 112-mile bike and a 26.2-mile run.

Sophs Fall To Mitchell

The Yankton Bucks sophomore football team lost to Mitchell Thursday 18-14.

Cody Hanzlik led the team in rushing with 30 yards followed by Ty Hauger with 15. Brady Hale passed for 91 yards, most of them going to Colton Froehrich who received 43 yards.

The Bucks scored on a 25 yard interception by Silas Schaeffer. The only other score of the night would come from Brady Hale with a one yard run and a successful two-point conversion.

On defense Steven McKee and Austin Schaeffer led the team with nine tackles each. Ty Hauger, Silas Schaeffer, Chris Brown and Isaac Althoff followed with seven tackles each. Chris Brown also added two interceptions on the night.

Yankton is now 1-6 on the season.

Yankton Frosh Roll Past Norfolk

The Yankton Bucks freshman football squad ran around, over and

through Norfolk on their way to a lopsided 56-0 victory Thursday in Yankton.

Parker Kuchta led the Bucks' attack with 107 yards on seven carries for an average of 15.3 yards per carry. Kuchta ran it in for a touchdown three separate times, twice in the second quarter, which was highlighted by a 48 yard dash to the endzone.

Levi Davis led the Bucks in total yards as he ran the ball nine times for 112 yards for an average of 12.3 yards per carry, and caught one pass for 43 yards. Davis added a touchdown on a punt return and also had five tackles and an interception on the defensive side.

Mason Strahl played the role of Yankton's utility man as Strahl was three for six through the air for 76 yards, and ran the ball five times for 35 yards and two touchdowns. Strahl also took the field for special teams and kicked six extra points through.

Jordan Lightner led the defense with six tackles and a sack. Lightner also ran the ball nine times for 25 yards and a score. Brad Ulmer was the other Buck to break into the endzone as Ulmer returned an interception 25 yards for a score.

The Yankton freshman will travel to Wagner to face the Red Raiders on Oct. 17. Kickoff is set for 4:15 p.m.

Oral Roberts Earns Preseason Nod In Summit League Men's Poll

ELMHURST, Ill. — Oral Roberts University received 27-of-32 first-place votes and was tabbed as the favorite to win the 2011-12 Summit League Men's Basketball Championship as selected by the annual preseason poll of league coaches, SIDs and media. IUPUI forward Alex Young, The Summit League's scoring leader, and first team NABC All-District selection last season, was the preseason choice for Player of the Year.

Two-time defending champion Oakland received four first-place votes and finished second in the poll, followed by South Dakota State, who received the remaining first-place vote, in third. IUPUI, North

Dakota State, IPFW, UMKC and Southern Utah held spots four through eight while Western Illinois and Summit League newcomer South Dakota, rounded out the poll.

Joining Young, The Summit League's active career leader in scoring and rebounding, on the preseason all-league first team were the Oral Roberts duo of Dominique Morrison, a two-time first team All-Summit performer, and Michael Craion, who missed last season due to injury after claiming the Newcomer of the Year Award in 2009-10. Oakland's Reggie Hamilton and South Dakota State's Nate Walters, both 2010-11 first team All-Summit selections, and IPFW's Frank Gaines, an honorable mention All-Summit pick a year ago, rounded out the first team.

Headlining the preseason all-league second team are Oral Roberts' Steven Rodriguez, the 2010-11 Summit League Newcomer of the Year and CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Freshman of the Year, Roundtree's ORU teammates Damen Bell-Holler and Warren Niles also were voted to the team and joined by South Dakota State's Jordan Dykstra, a Mid-Major Freshman All-America last season, and Western Illinois' Ceola Clark II, who returns from injury after earning The Summit League's Defensive Player of the Year honor in 2009-10.

ORU, which finished second last season after a 13-5 league record, is seeking its first Summit League Championship since the 2007-08 campaign. The Golden Eagles return five starters and eight letterwinners from last season when they earned a berth in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

Oakland, whose record setting teams went 17-1 in The Summit League each of the past two seasons, returns seven letterwinners, including three starters for Greg Kame, the reigning Coach of the Year. In addition to Hamilton, the Golden Grizzlies return Mid-Major Freshman All-America guard Travis Barber.

South Dakota State returns eight letterwinners, led by Walters, the league's top assist man a year ago, and Dykstra, who recorded the league's top three-point shooting percentage.

Both IUPUI and IPFW have new head coaches this season, both

of whom had served as their team's associate head coach. Todd Howard takes over a Jaguars program that brings back a league-high nine letterwinners while Tony Jasick will lead the Mastodons.

North Dakota State and UMKC each return a Summit League statistical leader from last season. Bison Marshall Bjorklund was tops in shooting percentage a year ago and the Kangaros' Reggie Chamberlain led in free throw percentage.

Northwestern Sweeps Preseason Picks

SIoux CITY, Iowa — Northwestern College earned the top spot in both the men's and women's preseason basketball polls for the Great Plains Athletic Conference, announced Thursday.

The Northwestern women received nine first place votes and totaled 99 points. The Red Raiders posted a 35-1 record last year and won the NAAIA Division II National Title. The Red Raiders went through league play undefeated at 18-0. Briar Cliff and Morningside each totaled 87 points and one first place vote a piece and tied for second. Concordia was picked fourth with 61 points.

The Northwestern men totaled 100 points and 10 first place votes. The Red Raiders posted a 22-9 record last year and won the GPAC regular season title with a 14-4 record. Dordt is picked second with 87 votes and the final first place vote. Morningside was third with 72 and Briar Cliff fourth with 65 tallies.

The MMC women ranked sixth in their poll, while the men were ranked last in the 11-team league.
