**Vermillion Police Seek Witnesses Of Assault**

VERMILLION — The Vermillion Police Department (VPD) is seeking witnesses in the assault of a 20-year-old male during the University of South Dakota's homecoming celebration.

At around 3 a.m. Sunday, medical units found the victim stumbling down the sidewalk in the 300 block of East Main Street. The man was bleeding from wounds to the neck and face.

He was transported to and treated at the Vermillion Sanford Hospital and later transported to Sioux Falls.

In an update provided Friday, the VPD is continuing the investigation into the assault that occurred shortly after midnight Sunday.

According to the press re-

lease, last weekend's assault occurred just outside the residence at 403 East Main Street, which is at the corner of Yale Street and Main Street. The victim, a Dakota Dunes resident, was visiting Vermillion for Dakota Days when he was hit over the head with a glass container. He suffered injuries to his head and neck that required hospitalization.

Witnesses stated that approximately 20 people were outside this residence participating in a house party when the assault occurred.

**Flood Presentation Set For Oct. 18**

VERMILLION — Tim Cowman will present "The Missouri River Flood of 2011: Causes, Impacts and Post-flood Policy Decisions" at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 18, at the W.H. Over Museum that is just east of the DakotaDome in Vermillion.

The presentation will discuss the events that contributed to this year's historic flood, including how the mainstem reservoir system failed to handle these events. Impacts of the flood on river geomorphology, the riparian ecosystem, and infrastructure built in the floodplain will also be discussed.

The presentation will conclude by looking at mainstem

reservoir and floodplain management alternatives that would reduce the impacts of future floods and provide opportunities for ecosystem restoration.

Cowman is the director of the Missouri River Institute at the University of South Dakota and a Natural Resources Administrator with the South Dakota Geological Survey. His work includes research on the geology and history of the Missouri River, with a focus on current and historical river geomorphology. He also studies the Missouri River steamboat era, and was part of a team that conducted a survey of the North Alabama steamboat discovery.
