

MMC Hosts One-Woman Musical Featuring Maxwell

Mount Marty College will host Linn Maxwell's performance of "Hildegard of Bingen and the Living Light" as this year's Benedictine Lecture. The one-woman musical play will be held at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 27, in Yankton at Mount Marty College's Marian Auditorium.

International mezzo soprano/actress Linn Maxwell embodies the extraordinary life of 12th century German prophetess, healer and composer, Hildegard of Bingen. Way ahead of her time and in a male-dominated world, Hildegard challenged the established authority of the Church, both philosophically and musically.

Accompanying herself on authentic medieval instruments including psaltery, organistrum and harp, Linn performs seven of Hildegard's original songs, and through the mystic's actual letters and writings transports us to the turbulent times of the Crusades in Western Europe. Hildegard's timeless universal message of spiritual truth, holistic healing and caring for the earth is more urgent today than ever.

In addition to her stage performance, Maxwell will share slides and anecdotes in a presentation titled, "Finding Hildegard" at 7:15 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 26, in the Chapter Room at Sacred Heart Monastery. She will talk about Bingen, Germany, and how she came to embrace the character of Hildegard.

Maxwell has performed on the stages of major orchestras including Chicago Symphony, Berlin Radio Orchestra, Cleveland, Toronto, Seattle and the Brooklyn Philharmonia. Her operatic engagements include San Francisco (Placido Domingo conducting), Cincinnati Opera, Hungarian State Opera, Netherlands Opera (with Nicholas Harnan-court), Strasbourg, Lyon, Toulouse, as well as recital halls across the United States and in 27 foreign countries.

I was browsing an internet news site this morning when I came across a story about a man who discovered his wife was having an affair using an app (application or program) for the Apple I phone that allows you to show your friends and family where you are. However this man's wife did not know he had installed it on her phone and he used that app to discover she was not where she said she would be. Now I am sure when someone developed that particular program there was no thought of using that for "surveillance" or helping spouses spy on each other. What amazes me, as one who is about to enter the wild world of smart phones is how much these things can do and how many programs are being developed and sold to do just about anything. I was amazed when I had my first GPS (Global Positioning System) that allowed me to find where I was when in the wilderness. (Of course I had to cross reference my paper map

to know for sure). Now I have a GPS with its own color map!

However I digress, as recently I attended a seminar entitled: "Living Traditionally in a New Age". Some of the information was really not new, like the reality that we are living in an era of rolling change, just look at that I Phone or the Droid or whatever your favorite is, in a few months it will be replaced by something newer and better and do more than your current phone can. Then you look at society and culture and the rolling change keeps moving. Then look at your church! Like most pastors and maybe people my age, this wasn't included when I was in school. I don't know how to cope with this kind of rapid rolling discontinuous change. I could handle the move from two row to four row, to twelve row planters and combines. That made sense. But going from a phone that was supposed to

help me make phone calls from anywhere to a device that allows me to surf the internet from anywhere, now that is a change that takes some getting used to. Back to the church, how does an institution that is hundreds if not thousands of years old make sense of the change? One way is to retreat and go back to the good old days, to ask your pastor/priest to tell you everything will be all right as long as we just do...! Another way is to look around and see what the latest and greatest technology is and try to adapt that to the church. Or maybe we just want to scream: "Is there an App for that?" To which I would respond, yep there is an App for that! There is an app that helps us cope with the rolling change, the discontinuous upheaval in our lives. It is not sold at the Apple store or downloaded off the internet (although I know you can find it there). Many of us already have

it close at hand. What is it you ask? It is found in going back and reading the Bible. Not to find the latest devotional thought for the day, but to listen to what God is saying. The place I would suggest you look is the prophet Jeremiah. This is the guy who lived through hard times, who faced the exile of the nation and lived to remind the people that God was still at work. I would also suggest a direction I have come across recently and that is to read Matthew 10 (once again not just for a devotional thought) and camp there for some time. I mean like every day for a month or more until you hear God (now I am a Reformed pastor so I am not sure you will hear an audible voice, but God and I tend to argue internally). Listen to the Gospel, listen to the prophet, and you will hear a way to deal with this change and turmoil around you. No this is not an instant fix, it will not give you all you ever wanted and more. But ultimately you will find a way to deal the seemingly insurmountable task of living traditionally in this new age.
