### Phishing Scam Targets AT&T Customers

PIERRE — An email scam requesting personal information from customers has been reported to the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission by AT&T officials. The email appears to originate from AT&T and prompts the user to provide account and credit card information. The PUC urges citizens to be mindful of opening emails or links and providing information to sources of which they are unsure. Misspellings or requests for banking information are common signs of a phishing scam. PUC Chairman Gary Hanson stated: "Being informed and taking the right precautions will go a long way in keeping consumers safe from scams. I encourage consumers to contact the company directly if they ever receive such a request." AT&T customers targeted by phishing should send a copy of the email to the company at abuse@att.net. Consumers are encouraged to report any potential telecommunications scams they encounter to the PUC by calling 1-800-332-1782 or sending an email to PUC-ConsumerInfo@state.sd.us..

### FEMA Helpline Still Available

PIERRE — Information and assistance is still available for those who have registered with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), disaster officials have announced. "The deadline to register with us has passed," said FEMA's Federal Coordinating Officer Gary Stanley. "But we want those who have already registered with us to know they can still reach us for information about their case or any follow-up questions they may have." The phone number for those who have questions for FEMA is 800-621-FEMA (3362), option 3. A TTY number for those with hearing problems is 800-462-7585. The phone lines are available from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. CDT. A total of 1,751 homeowners, renters and businesses in South Dakota had registered with FEMA by the close of the application period on Monday, Oct. 24. While applications continue to be processed, more than \$4 million in grants already have been given, and the U. S. Small Business Administration has approved almost \$5.4 million in federal disaster loans for residents and businesses. An additional \$22.8 million has been given in grants by FEMA and the South Dakota Office of Emergency Management to local government agencies and some nonprofits to help rebuild infrastructure damaged by this year's floods. That program continues to process applications and give grants.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly rose Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery rose 0.50 cent to \$6.4450 a bushel; December corn rose 3.50 cents to \$6.55 a bushel; December oats rose 2.75 cents to \$3.3625 a bushel; while November soybeans fell 18 cents to \$12.17 a bushel. Beef and pork futures mostly fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle fell 0.85 cent to \$1.1905 a pound; November feeder cattle fell 0.47 cent to \$1.4110 a pound; while December lean hogs rose 0.02 cent to 86.67 cents a pound.
