Schell Lecture To Address Civil War

VERMILLION — The University of South Dakota Department of History welcomes James Marten, Ph.D., for the 2011 Herbert S. Schell Lecture. Marten's address, "A Generation Set Apart: Union Civil War Veterans and Northern Society," is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 2, at the Freedom Forum Conference Room at the Al Neuharth Media Center.

Marten is professor of history and chair at Marquette University and a member of the Program of Distinguished Lecturers of the Organization of American Historians. He teaches courses on the Civil War and on children's history. He is the author of "The Children's Civil War" (1998), which was selected as an Outstanding Academic Book by Choice Magazine, and "Sing Not War: The Lives of Union and Confederate Veterans in Gilded Age America" (2011). He also directs Children in Urban America (www.marquette.edu/cuap, an on-line archive of documents related to the history of children, funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities).

Sponsored by the USD Department of History, the Schell Lecture is named after Dean Herbert S. Schell (1899-1994), who served the University of South Dakota and the State of South Dakota for more than 40 years. Schell provided leadership as history department chair from 1946 to 1955. From 1936 to 1964, he served as director and then dean of the USD Graduate School. Following his retirement, Schell was University Archivist and received the title Dean Emeritus in 1969. Additionally, he was presented with the Will G. Robinson Memorial Award and was inducted into the Western Writers Hall of Fame for his work in western and South Dakota history. Schell was also the first scholar to receive the annual South Dakota Cowboy and Western Heritage Hall of Fame Writer of the Year Award in 1983.

Renovated Organ To Be Re-Dedicated With Nov. 2 Recital At USD's Slagle Hall

VERMILLION — The 29-stop organ built for the University of South Dakota in 1925 will be re-dedicated at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 2, with a recital in the Bailey and Kathy Aalfs Auditorium at Slagle Hall.

David Higgs, chair of the organ department at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, N.Y., will perform the re-dedication recital.

Higgs has performed concerts throughout the world, including England, Canada and Austria. He has served as an adjudicator for prominent organ competitions,

and he has performed at numerous national and regional organist conventions.

The concert is free and open to the public.

Phil and Marge Odeen and Tom and Cindy Lillibridge donated funds to renovate the 68-year-old organ. Repairs included finishing the fourth keyboard by providing stops intended but not provided during its construction. The renovation also afforded new wiring that allows for greater flexibility for the organist to change sounds or stops.
