

found a place. We just don't know where it will be until December."

The reorganization is a result of an Army-wide reduction in artillery troops.

"The first battalion 147th infantry, along with state leadership, has decided what they are going to do is take the whole battalion — they are losing about 110 positions in the battalion of about 360 or so- and reorganize it," Schild said. "They are going to look at the soldiers in all the batteries from Aberdeen to Salem, Mitchell, Sioux Falls, Yankton and then they are going to find the soldiers that have the best fits for the positions out of all of the personnel."

Schild said the soldiers were told everything from physical training and fitness, and height and weight standards, to how soldiers are doing on their evaluations will fill a unit in Yankton that will be Bravo Battery. He suspects it will be a mixture of people from mostly the current Bravo and Charlie batteries.

"All artillery units Army-wide will be losing one battery and, in the numerical way of the Army, you can't go Alpha, Charlie, so of course that means Alpha and Bravo will be around and Charlie will be going away," Schild said. "That is just a logistics side of the deal. There will not be a Charlie Battery in the whole Army — it isn't that they are picking on Yankton. So in that sense, Charlie Battery will be going away."

However, Schild said one of the reasons he feels there will still be a unit here at all, is because of the support of the community.

"The reason why we are keeping an armory and the reason so many soldiers will be able to stay in Yankton is because of the community support for Charlie Battery," he said. "Without it, we could have been gone. There is so much support for Charlie Battery here that the quote they told us was, 'Nobody knows what the future will be, but for the foreseeable future, they don't see a unit leaving Yankton.'"

As for who will be leaving Yankton and who will be staying, the decision is expected

at Charlie Battery's December drill. "The timeline will be that first-sergeants and leadership people are going to be getting together (and) putting faces with places, trying to have the new Batteries set by December," Schild said. "After December drill, when they have placed the people, they are going to try to find some double slotting for up to two years, where maybe two soldiers can be in one position, depending on what the situation. At the end of the two years, they have to be somewhere else, either through attrition or advancement."

Schild said no matter who is still here when the reorganization is completed, every guard location will be affected.

"In the end, even the unit that comes in is going to lose four people, so not only is Charlie Battery going to go away, the other batteries are losing people as well," Schild said. "Then you will start adding support and other things, so quite a few positions are going away. But we are at the end of a war, we still have something going on in Afghanistan, the Army is losing funding, so you have to look at how they are going to restructure and meet the needs of the next decade or so. What they have determined is that they don't need as many field artillery people."

Schild said the reorganization does have one benefit: It is bringing back together many of the men and women who served together during the 2005 deployment to Iraq.

"One of the weird things that will happen is that every time we have deployed, especially in 2005, we didn't have enough in the unit to fill the mission so we drew from around the area," he said. "Some of us old 2005 Charlie Battery will be getting back together again for the first time. So it is not all terrible stuff. There will be some good things and some heartache."

"Other units have done the same thing in the state where we have had reorganization, they may be combined and now they are a strong unit. I am sure that will happen here."

For now, the unit is working to plan a reunion for the 2005 Charlie Battery and a ceremony for the last time the Charlie Battery flag is lowered.

"Charlie Battery has been in Yankton for 44 years," Schild said. "When that flag comes down, and Bravo goes up, there will be some function that night."

plowed became impassible because the trees were falling so fast.

One of the few businesses open in the area was a Big Y grocery store that had a generator. Customers loaded up on supplies, heard news updates over the intercom, charged up their cell phones, and waited for a suddenly hard-to-get cup of coffee — in a line that was 30 people deep and growing.

Many of the areas hit by the storm had also been hit by Irene. In New Jersey's Hamilton Township, Tom Jacobsen also recalled heavy spring flooding and a particularly heavy winter before that.
