Monday marked a special anniversary for me, one I'd have never quessed would happen when I first started my jour-

I marked 20 years of working in the Press & Dakotan sports department.
The reason I say that I didn't see things going this way when started is because this wasn't my career path. Twenty years ago, I planned to become a teacher and a coach, teaching mathematics and probably coaching basketball. The P&D was a fun part-time job to help pay the bills.

Then, after two years of working on the Moderator, MMC's school paper, and five months as a part-time professional journalist, I decided to make my hobby my career.

Little did I know that three years after making that decision, at the ripe old age of 23, I would be in charge of the sports department at one of the state's daily newspapers. Twelve years after that, I became one of the youngest recipients ever to receive the South Dakota High School Activities Association's "Distinguished Service Award," a lifetime achievement

honor for my work, not only in covering high school athletics, but in training young people to do so as well.

It has been a crazy 20 years that have seen a ton of changes. One thing that hasn't, though, is the desire to cover high school and college sports and help young people get on the right track towards sports journalism careers of their own.


