- Bomgaars Supply will hold a grand opening in its new location at 1818 Broadway on Friday and Saturday October 5-6, it was announced by Glenn Talsma, manager. Free coffee and doughnuts will be served from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. Friday and from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Saturday.

Saturday, October 3, 1987

- A little smoke in downtown Yankton early Friday evening turned into a roaring fire that billowed smoke throughout several blocks before destroying the building housing Austin Battin's optometry office. It was the seventh Yankton business to be destroyed or damaged by fire since 1983.
- Kirk Wallman rushed for 171 yards Friday to lead Freeman to a 24-22 win over Montrose/Canisota in a Cornbelt conference game. Wallman scored on runs of 34 and 55 yards while teammate Dean Herbold scored two touchdowns, one on a 70-yard punt return and another on a 58-yard run
