Agriculture Tom Vilsack in regard to the new rules implemented as part of the 2010 Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act.

"I have heard from parents and school officials across South Dakota that their kids are not getting enough to eat in order to learn and stay energized throughout the school day," she wrote. "As a mother of three, with two children in the public school system, I know that providing a meal means more than food on a plate. Every child is different, and therefore their activity level and caloric requirements

Noem posed a handful of questions to Vilsack, including whether his department would conduct an evaluation of the cost for school districts to implement the program and provide an analysis of the amount of food bought by students before and after the changes.

While Noem was focused on the lunch program Wednesday afternoon, as well as a visit to teacher Doug Haar's advanced placement (AP) government class, she was not insulated from the rigors of the cam paign trail.

Noem, who was voted into office in 2010, is facing off with Democrat Matt Varilek in the Nov. 6 general election.

The Varilek campaign criticized Noem for skipping a Subcommittee on Early Childhood, Elementary and Secondary Education meeting on May 13, 2011, that addressed the consequences of the then-forthcoming changes to the school lunch program.

The campaign said Noem has skipped six out of the seven subcommittee hearings held since she was elected.

We're seeing a pattern here — Congresswoman Noem isn't showing up for South Dakota," Varilek stated in a media release. "This is now the third committee where Congresswoman Noem has been missing in action. She failed to show up to get a farm bill passed, she failed to show up to represent the interests of Native Americans, and now we're seeing that she failed to show up for our school children."

The campaign has previously criticized Noem for not attending House Agriculture Committee and Indian Affairs subcommittee

In the case of the May 13, 2011, subcommittee hearing on the school lunch program, Andrea McCarthy, communications director for Noem, said the representative had good reason to miss it. The meeting was held on a Friday and got pushed back from its original start time, McCarthy said. Noem had to catch a plane that day to get back to South Dakota for the activation of the South Dakota National Guard's 200th Engineer Company in Pierre the next morning. McCarthy added that she was not en-

tirely sure as of Wednesday afternoon if Noem had missed six out of seven of the education subcommittee hearings. David Benson, Varilek's campaign manager, was resolute that six meetings had

been missed. 'Though legitimate scheduling conflicts explain a small number of her absences, her pattern of behavior makes it clear that she simply has not made it a priority to attend congressional hearings on issues important to South Dakota such as agriculture, Native affairs and education," he told the Press &

On the issue of the school lunch program, Benson said Varilek takes the subject personally as someone who received reduced-price school lunches.

'Local flexibility is part of the solution on this issue, but the bigger threat to child nutrition is Congresswoman Noem's votes for cuts to the school lunch program in the Ryan Budget," Benson said.
