Gazelles Begin State Softball Today BY JAMES D. CIMBUREK

Yankton's 18-11 record was only good enough for the seventh seed in the South Dakota Class A high school softball tournament, which begins today (Friday) at Sherman Park in Sioux Falls. Head coach Bernie Goeden, though, feels the team has the talent to compete.

Yankton plays second-seeded Rapid City Stevens in the opening round of the nine-team double-elimination event. Through 29 games, the team is about where Goeden expected, even if the seed is not.

"Record-wise we're pretty close to where I thought we'd be," he said. "I thought we'd get a higher seed at state.'

The Gazelles have relied on a pair of young pitchers, Jaclyn Arens (9-10, 4.75 ERA, 55 K in 107 2/3 IP) and Kalyn Peterka (8-1, 4.86 ERA, 22 K in 49 IP), this season. While the strikeout numbers aren't high the team is averaging three strikeouts per seven innings — the walk numbers are even better. Arens is averaging five strikeouts for every walk, walking just 11 of 513 batters faced.

"Our emphasis has been to throw strikes, let them put the ball in play," Goeden said. "We don't need strikeouts if we keep the walks down.'

With a young pitching staff, the Gazelles had to rework their defensive lineup to handle a pitching-tocontact approach.

"We changed around our infield halfway through the season to strengthen our outfield," Goeden said. "We moved one of our infielders to the outfield so that we'd have more speed in the outfield.

Veterans Jessica Wirth and Abby Schulte, each with 10 extra-base hits on the season, have led the Yankton offensive assault.

"Our offense has come along pretty well," Goeden said. "Jessica is batting over .450 and Abby's over 400."

Wirth comes in to state batting .458 with two home runs, eight triples and 22 RBI. Schulte is batting .415 with a home run, a team-high six triples, three doubles and a team-best 30 RBI.

Bucks Host Top-Ranked Washington

One week after losing to third-ranked Roosevelt, the challenge gets even tougher for the Yankton Bucks as undefeated and top-ranked Sioux Falls Wash-ington visits Crane-Youngworth Field tonight for a non-conference 11AA football contest.

The Warriors, 6-0, have been ranked first in the Class 11AA South Dakota Sportswriters Association Poll all season long after returning a number of starters from the 2011 squad that finished runner-up to Roosevelt in the state title game last fall.

Washington had been barreling through their competition this season, outscoring opponents by an average of 43 points per game until narrowly escaping Pierre with a 27-20 victory over the Governors last Friday. The Warriors turned the ball over six times in the tight victory.

According to Bucks head coach Arlin

Likness, that last fact shows just how tough Washington is this season. The biggest challenge is they have

no weaknesses," Likness said. "Pierre got six turnovers against Washington and still lost. You can't afford to make many mistakes if any."

The Bucks saw a few of those mistakes come back to haunt them in last Friday's 35-21 loss to the Rough Riders at Howard Wood Field.

For the first time this season, Yankton (5-1, ranked fifth in the latest Class 11AA S.D. Sportswriters Association Poll) had more turnovers than takeaways last week, as the Bucks lost a fumble and also saw quarterback Michael Rucker throw two costly interceptions. Yankton also was unable to punch their opening drive into the endzone despite two attempts at their opponents goal line.

"That goal line stand and the two interceptions, those three plays were very costly for us," Likness said.

Despite the miscues, Yankton's of-

fense still moved the ball against the Rough Riders, especially on the ground. Sophomore Levi Davis rushed 16 times for 102 yards while James Hisek (78 yards) and Jordan Lightner (41 yards) also played big parts in the rushing attack.

Hisek suffered a concussion in the fourth quarter of the loss and will be out this week, which paves the way for senior Evan Schroeder to return to the starting lineup at running back after missing parts of the last month with leg injuries.

Besides Hisek, also out of the lineup tonight will be two-way starter Dustin Hopper (head injury) as well as tight end and punter Troy Hunhoff (sprained ankle).

Brady Hale, who assumed kicking duties after starter Lane Sawatzke was injured two weeks ago against Brookings, will be called upon to punt in Hunhoff's absence.

Andi Sprakel (.370, 1 HR, 3 triples, 4 doubles) is also a run-producer, with 20 RBI on the season. Karlee Kozak (.298, 4 doubles, 3 triples, 16 RBI) has scored 25 runs out of the leadoff spot. Hannah Horn (.203, 13 RBI. 20 runs). Brooke Loecker (.224, 4 doubles, 13 RBI, 14 runs), Arens (.240, 10 RBI, 11 runs) and Jennifer Feilmeier (.333, 2 doubles, 4 triples, 17 runs, 13 RBI) have driven in double digit runs. Tayler Hutchison (.200, 6 RBI, 7 runs), Kourtney Erickson (.125, 2 RBI, 6 runs) and Peterka (.424, 7 runs, 8 RBI) have also been contributors.

The Gazelles will need a strong defensive effort to extend their stay in the tournament beyond the three games the tournament format guarantees.

"We need to play good defense," Goeden said. "Defense has been both our strength and our weakness. If we play good defense, we stay in the game. If our defense lets us down, those are the games that are not competitive.

Yankton has allowed 167 runs on the season, 55 of which have been unearned. The Gazelles have scored 197 runs on the season.

The Class A tournament runs through Saturday. The Class B tournament, a six-team field that includes Dakota Valley, begins on Saturday and runs through Sunday at Sherman Park.
