

Quick Hitters

■ Linebacker T.J. Lally was among 16 players named Wednesday to the official watch list for the Jerry Rice Award as the top freshman in the Division I Football Championship Subdivision. The Rice Award, named for the legendary wide receiver, who played in the FCS (then Division I-AA) at Mississippi Valley State, will be voted on by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The list will grow to 20 finalists by then, with the award to be presented Dec. 17 in Philadelphia.

■ Senior wide receiver Tyrel Kool recently was named a semifinalist for the 2012 National Football Foundation's National Scholar-Athlete Awards, including the prestigiou William V. Campbell Trophy awarded to the top football scholar-athlete in the nation. A Yankton native, Kool is one of 147 college football players to be nominated for the Campbell Trophy. Candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduudent in their final year of eligibility. a grade-point average of at least 3.2 4.0 scale, have outstanding football as a first-team player or significant butor, and have demonstrated strong rship and citizenship. The class is seeach year by the NFF Awards Come, which is comprised of a nationally nized group of media, College Foothall of Famers and athletics adminis-

■ Through five games, sophomore running back Zach Zenner has piled up 137 carries for 1,077 yards and six touchdowns, as well as eight catches for 44 yards. His 215.4 yards per game average is more than 30 yards a game better than his closest competitor, Wofford's Eric Breitenstein (72-735, 9 TD, 183.75 average). Shakir Bell of MVFC rival Indiana State is a distant third at 164.8 yards per game (127-824, 7 TD).

■ Senior linebacker Ross Shafroth is tied for ninth in FCS football with 11.4 tackles per game. He leads the MVFC in that category, with Indiana State's Jacolby Washington second at 11 stops a game (tied for 15th in FCS). Shafroth also is tied for 41st in FCS with 0.4 interceptions per

■ Junior linebacker Anthony Peete is tied for 28th in FCS with 1.4 tackles for loss per contest. The Jackrabbits have several defenders ranked in the top 50 in the FCS in sacks per game: T.J. Lally (t20, 0.8 per game), junior DL Marshall Deugh (t35, 0.7) and senior DL David Hettiger

■ SDSU ranks fifth in FCS in points allowed per game, at 14 per contest, and eighth in yards allowed per game, giving up 294.2 yards per contest. North Dakota leads the nation in defense at 204 yards allowed and 8.75 points allowed per game.

Quick Hitters

■ Nebraska trailed 27-10 with 10:29 left in the third quarter, before rallying to win 30-27 last week against Wisconsin. The comeback from a 17-point deficit for a victory tied the second-largest comeback in school history, trailing only Nebraska's rally from a 21-point deficit in the third quarter last season against Ohio State.

■ The Buckeyes feature one of the nation's top underclassmen in sophomore quarterback Braxton Miller, Miller ranks 13th nationally by averaging 115.4 rushing yards per game. He has also thrown for 933 yards with eight touchdowns and three interceptions, ranking 41st nationally in passing efficiency.

■ Nebraska and Ohio State are two of just seven programs with 800 all-time victories. Nebraska became the fourth school to reach the 850-victory plateau (Michigan, Notre Dame, Texas) last week against Wisconsin and Ohio State enters Saturday's game with 830 all-time wins.

Nebraska coach Bo Pelini is a 1990 graduate of Ohio State, where he was a starting safety and a captain.

Key Matchup

The Cornhuskers' front seven led by DT Baker Steinkuhler and MLB Will Compton against Ohio State's running attack. The Buckeyes do not want to have QB Braxton Miller subjected to a lot of hard hits and starting RB Jordan Hall is doubtful (partially torn ligament in his right knee). They'd prefer to hand the ball to RBs Carlos Hyde, Rod Smith and Bri'onte Dunn. If Nebraska shuts down the backs. Ohio State will be forced to lean even more on Miller. (AP)
