CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly fell Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for December delivery fell 29.25 cents to \$8.5675 a bushel; December corn fell 20.50 cents to \$7.5275 a bushel; December oats rose 3.50 cents to \$3.92 a bushel; while November soybeans fell 26 cents to \$15.2250 a bushel.
Beef futures rose and pork traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
December live cattle fell 0.42 cent to \$1.2550 a pound; November feeder cattle rose 0.42 cent to \$1.4422 a pound; while December lean hogs rose 0.87 cent to 78.37 cents a pound.
