### **Quick Hitters**

■ Even though Zach Zenner's 182yard performance against Missouri State last week was a season low the SDSU sophomore running back is still on pace to make a run at the Jackrabbits' single-season rushing record, held by Tyndall native Josh Ranek. Ranek, the former CFL standout, owns the top three single-season rushing efforts in SDSU history, topped by the 2,055 yards he rushed for in 1999. Zenner is at 1,077 yards through five games.

■ Western Illinois running back Nikko Watson comes into this week's game off a season-best 126 yards against South Dakota last week. Last season, as a freshman, Watson rushed for 170 yards.

■ South Dakota State has won seven straight games against FCS opponents, their longest streak against FCS foes since making the move from Division II. ■ Last week's win at South Dakota

ended an eight-game road losing streak for Western Illinois. The Leathernecks had lost six straight against FCS foes. ■ Western Illinois junior wide receiver Fredson Salomon earned MVFC New-

comer of the Week honors for his 109yard, 2 TD performance in the Leathernecks' win over USD. He had come into the game with just 92 receiving vards and no touchdowns.

■ South Dakota State will induct five members into its Jackrabbit Sports Hall of Fame at halftime: Joel Brandt, Brad Reynolds, Karla Stevenson, Adam Timmer

and Don Trapp. ■ The game is also Military Appreciation Night. Active military personnel and veterans presenting proper identification at the southwest stadium entrance will receive two free tickets to the game.

#### **Key Matchup**

SDSU front 7 vs. Western Illinois offensive line: Even though the Leathernecks had a 100-yard rusher last week in Watson, WIU has not been an offensive juggernaut this season. The Leathernecks will have their hands full up front against a defense that ranks second in the nation with 3.6 sacks per game, sixth in scoring defense (14 ppg allowed) and 13th in rush defense (110 yards allowed per game).

#### ■ The 63 points Ohio State put up on Nebraska last week is the fourth-most ever

allowed by a Cornhusker team. ■ Nebraska senior I-back Rex Burkhead's 73-yard run in the first quarter was a career-best, breaking the 61-yard run he

had against Idaho State earlier this season. That 73-yard run gave him exactly 3,000 yards for his career, making him the seventh Husker to break the 3K mark in career rushing. ■ Nebraska broke the 30-point barrier

for the sixth time this season, the first time the Cornhuskers had scored 30 points or more in six straight games since hitting that mark seven straight times in 2007-08. ■ The 106,102 Nebraska played in

front of at Ohio State is the fourth-largest crowd for a Husker game in the program's history. Three of the top four games in attendance have come since the Huskers have joined the Big Ten. ■ Senior defensive back Justin

Blatchford was one of the game captains for Nebraska for the Ohio State game. He is from Ponca, Neb. ■ Against Ohio State, Nebraska failed to break the 250-yard barrier for team

rushing for the first time this season, rushing for 223 yards. During the Bo Pelini era, Nebraska is now 28-4 when rushing for over 200 yards.

■ Next week's game at Northwestern will be the first time the Huskers have traveled to Northwestern since 1931
