

USD Women's Golf Team Places

14th In Missouri

SPRINGFIELD, Mo.—First-year South Dakota golfer Victoria Grasso finished 49th of 93 golfers in leading the Coyotes to a 14th-place finish at Missouri State's Payne Stewart Memorial hosted Monday and Tuesday by River-cut Golf Course.

Arkansas-Little Rock held off Missouri State in both the team and individual race. The Trojans' Emelie Westrup shot a final round, 2-under-par 70 to finish one stroke better than the Bears' Emma Clegg and capture medalist honors. Westrup finished the 54-hole event at 2-over-par.

Missouri State placed three golfers in the top 10, but finished two strokes back of UALR in a field that included five teams from the Missouri Valley, three from the Summit League and Nebraska from the Big Ten.

Grasso finished at 28-over-par. Her 6-over-par 78 in round one was team low for the tournament. Sophomore Janice Baumberger tied for 77th place at 43-over-par. Sophomore Jordan Rearik and senior Nicole Funck finished one stroke back in 80th place. Sophomore Stephanie Rodgers (+48) rounded out the Coyotes' lineup.

The Payne Stewart Memorial was the fourth of five fall events for the Coyotes. The team completes its fall slate at the Pat Bradley Invitational in Lakewood Ranch, Fla., Oct. 22-23.

Vikings To Host Steelers In London Next Year

CHICAGO (AP) — The NFL is doubling down on London.

The league announced Tuesday that the Minnesota Vikings will host the Pittsburgh Steelers at London's Wembley Stadium on Sept. 29, 2013.

The Jacksonville Jaguars will host the San Francisco 49ers at Wembley on Oct. 27, 2013. This is the first time the NFL will play two regular-season games in London in the same season.

The Vikings previously played a preseason game in London in 1983. The Steelers have never played in Lon-

don, but did play an exhibition game in Dublin. They have played seven international exhibition games, the last against the Buffalo Bills in Toronto four years ago.

St. Louis hosts New England on Oct. 28 in this year's game at Wembley.

Mary Promotes Neumann To

Head Women's Basketball Coach

BISMARCK, N.D. (AP) — The University of Mary has named a new head women's basketball coach.

Longtime assistant Rick Neumann becomes the eighth head coach of the women's program in the history of the Bismarck school. He replaces Fred Fridley, who resigned earlier this fall to take a job with Sanford Health.

Mary advanced to three national tournaments under Fridley. Athletic Director Roger Thomas says Neumann worked side by side with Fridley to create the successful program.

Neumann was hired as an assistant at Mary in 2003, the same year Fridley became the head coach. The team has won 170 games since then.
