Ground was broken on the bank's current location at 332 Broadway Avenue on March 15, 1984.

Construction commenced the next month, and Valley State Bank opened its doors March 11, 1985. Meanwhile, demolition of the old bank building began on March 9 to make way for the parking lot of the newly-opened Valley State Bank.
