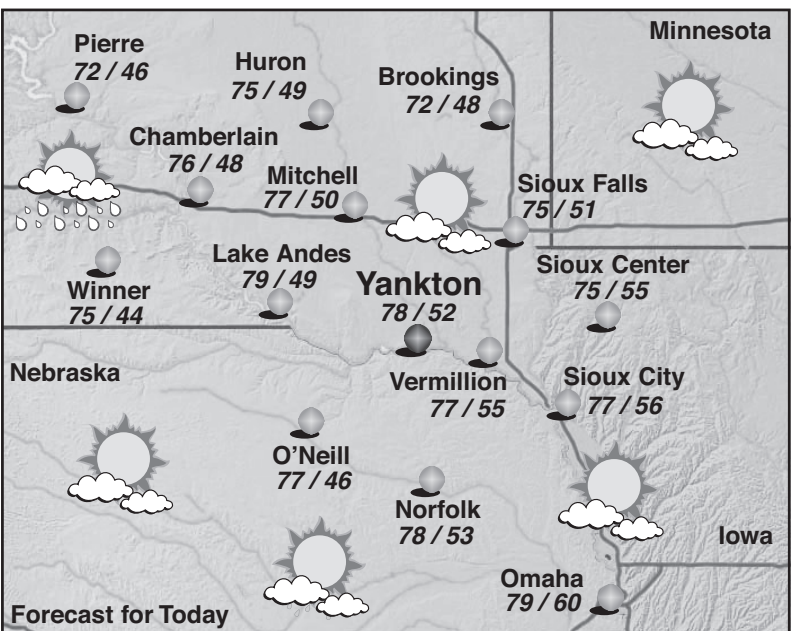

about the investigation because it involved a student.
Freeman High School principal Kim Krull acknowledged an incident occurred last week.
"There was a security issue here, and we have acted on it," he said. "It's under investigation, and at the current time, there is no breach of security."
Krull said he couldn't comment much further because the issue involved a student issue and possibly a legal issue.
He couldn't release the student's name or disclose whether

the student remains in attendance at the school.
Krull commended the staff's response to the incident.
"The staff reacted appropriately," he said, adding the faculty was reassured that the matter had been handled.
The issue was turned over to law enforcement, Krull said.
"Everybody involved with this has cooperated fully," he added.
Krull noted the Freeman school district follows state law as the basis for its computer policy and operation.
The school has maintained its normal routine, and daily classes and operations remain safe, the principal added.
