land being offered to the City of Yankton by the state to instead utilizing it to build a sports facility.

No specific projects were dis-

cussed Tuesday. On Monday, the City Commission voted to redefine the boundaries of the proposed BID. Instead of including all hotels and lodging establishments in Yankton, it will only affect those with 25 or more rooms. Smaller facilities can volun-

teer to be included. Mayor Nancy Wenande has said that definition of the boundaries is used in other South Dakota cities.

Hotels with 25 or more rooms are the Best Western Kelly Inn, the Holiday Inn Express, the Days Inn, the Super 8 and the Broadway Inn. sion voted to add Sarah Haberman

of the Kelly Inn to the BID board. The board members said Tuesday they will seek another hotel owner or manager to fill out the seventh and last position on the

governing body. Most of the meeting was spent poring over the BID board's bylaws and plan. Of particular interest was a portion that dictates how the money raised by the occupancy tax can be spent.

The board tentatively approved a version that would leave its options open to discussion. Eligible expenses could include "visitor facilities, events, attractions and activities which benefit the City and the hotels, motels and lodging establishments located in the district." Money could also be spent

on public improvements associated with the aforementioned ex-

The board wanted to make sure the adopted language is agreeable to the two members who could not be present Tuesday before making it permanent.

"My belief is the board will make good decisions, and the City Commission will support those good decisions made as to how best to use funds for the future of Yankton," Stephenson said. "Leaving options open at this point makes a lot of sense to me."

The board hopes to be able to present its plan to the City Commission next month so it can commence with the process of officially establishing the BID.

"I'm generally against taxes, but I think this is a good one," Stephenwas pretty with the Yankton Area Chamber of Commerce several years ago when we caught up with the rest of the state in getting the (bed, booze and board) tax in place as a funding source for economic development purposes in the community. That's made a ton of sense, and I think this will, too. It's similar to what we're used to paying everywhere else in the state (for an overnight stay) and much higher everywhere we go outside of the


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
