cause, as well as one dedicated to Amanda Todd, a 15year-old Canadian girl who committed suicide earlier this month after being bullied.

While her campaign is just getting started, Bowker said it didn't take long for people to join the cause. After only a few days, she had more than 200 supporters, and that list continues to grow daily, she said.

"People have messaged me, people are watching my videos and people are writing me saying they want to help in any way they can," she said.

Bowker said her ultimate goal is to create a volunteer outreach program that will serve Yankton and surrounding communities by providing bullied and troubled students opportunities to speak with others close to their own age. While guidance counselors are typically available at schools for bullied students, she said she believes that more students will seek out help if they also have the option of speaking with their peers.

"I don't think most of them want to talk to an adult about being bullied," Bowker said. "I want to make it easy for them to just go and talk.

She said she hopes to visit soon with area schools about a potential outreach program, but for now, she is focused on getting as many supporters as she can.

"I'm looking for anyone from teenagers to young adults for the program, but adults need to speak up, too," she said.
