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rigation of up to 300 acres and fire protection at the Wynstone Housing Development. **CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATION**

FOR THE PROPOSED  
PROJECTS AT YANKTON,  
SOUTH DAKOTA

The South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) has conducted a review of a proposal from the city of Yankton, South Dakota, that involves the construction of a new lift station.

The East Highway 50 Lift Station project involves the installation of new gravity sewer lines and force main and the construction of a lift station. The sewer line project begins at the Chesterman lift station near Highway 50 and continues southwest where it terminates at the wastewater treatment plant. Two existing lift stations, Chesterman and Dale, will be replaced by the proposed list station located approximately 600 feet south of the Dale lift station.

The City of Yankton was awarded a \$3,330,000 Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan (3.0 percent - 20 years). Current wastewater rates are \$29.08 per month based on 5,000 gallons usage and are expected to increase to \$32.67 per month by November, 2013. Repayment of the SRF loan will be with wastewater revenues.

Listed below are the reasons for granting a categorical exclusion:

1. The project is solely directed toward minor rehabilitation of existing facilities, functional replacement of equipment, or towards the construction of new ancillary facilities or appurtenant to existing facilities.

2. The project does not affect the degree of treatment or capacity of the existing facilities.

3. The project involves new sanitary sewer or storm sewer within the developed portion of the community.

4. No comments requiring mitigative action were received from any of the five review agencies or through the public participation process.

The proposed action does not involve any serious local objections nor does it meet any of the criteria for not granting a categorical exclusion as specified in [Section 6.505(c) (i) through (iii) of 40 CFR Part 6, Subpart E].

The planning area is located in the city of Yankton. The wastewater system improvement project will not affect any historical or archaeological resources. The new improvements should have no adverse effects on plant life or wildlife. No other environmentally sensitive issues have been identified in the planning of this project. Minor noise, air pollution, and soil erosion problems will occur during construction, but these will be only temporary in nature.

The review process did not indicate that significant environmental impacts would result from the proposed projects. Consequently, a preliminary decision not to prepare an EIS has been made. This action is taken on the basis of a careful review of the engineering

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report, environmental information documents, correspondence with responsible governmental agencies, and other supporting data which are on file at the Division of Financial and Technical Assistance, Water Resources Assistance Program, DENR, Pierre, South Dakota, and are available for public scrutiny at the Yankton city office in Yankton, South Dakota.

Comments supporting or disagreeing with this decision may be submitted for consideration by DENR after publication of the Categorical Exclusion Determination. After evaluating the comments received, DENR will make a final decision.

complete the project by Nov. 21 as specified in the contract.

"There will be some work left for next year," he stated. "Some seasonal limitations are going to run out on us on some phases of the work."

Peterson said PCIRoads had some big projects in the region this year, including interstate work near Mitchell and Watertown, which delayed its work on Highway 50.

"Us being down on the southern end of the state with a little more temperate climate, we're the last ones to see them pretty much every year," Peterson said. The dry year has helped with the reconstruction of Highway 50, he added.

"Highway 50 is down in the Missouri River bottom, so it has historically had very wet sub-grades," Peterson said. "We've struggled to get quality sub-bases to pour our concrete on in the past. But with this year being so dry, everything worked well. We've got a superb, quality project evolving out of this."
