- Thousands of spectators began gathering today for the South Dakota corn husking contest which was scheduled for this afternoon at the Jacob Krull farm a mile and a half south of here (Watertown).

- A children's party at the Dakota theater at 7 p.m. next Wednesday, October 31 will be the principal feature of the annual Youth Honor Day observance of Yankton lodge 1356, Loyal Order of Moose. A Bowery Boys comedy, "Ghost Chasers," and cartoons will make up the movie entertainment.

- Ten Quester chapters in South Dakota will be seeking \$3,000 in funds to help light the interior of the newly-restored Capital Dome at Pierre. These chapters hope to have the project in place for the South Dakota Quester State Convention at Pierre during the state's centennial in 1989.

Deadline Is Nov. 1 For VFW, Auxiliary 'Voice Of Democracy' Contest

Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) announced the kick-off of the 66th year of the VFW and its Ladies Auxiliary Voice of Democracy Scholarship Competition. Local high school students have the opportunity to compete for thousands of dollars in scholarships and a trip to Washington, D.C.

Students begin by competing at the local Post level with a deadline of Nov. 1. Post winners advance to District and then the first place District winner advances to the state competition. All state winners receive a four-day trip to Washington, D.C. A total of \$152,000 is awarded to national finalists. First place is \$30,000. Annually the VFW provides more than \$2.3 million in scholarships.

Each year, around 50,000 students participate in the competition. Students must write and record a three- to five-minute essay on this theme for 2012-2013, "Is Our Constitution Still Relevant?" on an audio cassette tape or audio CD and present their recording, typed essay, and entry form at their local VFW Post.
