
MATCHUPS

COYOTE OFFENSE VS. SYCAMORES DEFENSE

Indiana State's defense is top-5 in the country for a reason. The Sycamores have allowed just three offensive touchdowns over their past four games (all wins). The Covotes, meanwhile, managed just 76 total vards last week and have struggled on offense over the last six quarters. Significant edge to ISU.

COYOTE DEFENSE VS. SYCAMORES OFFENSE

Shakir Bell. That's all you need to know about this matchup. The ISU junior averages 144.5 yards rushing each game and has scored nine touchdowns. He is also one of the toughest backs in the country to bring down, evidenced by his 5.6 yards per carry.



South Dakota struggled in this area last weekend to North Dakota State, frequently allowing big returns and again allowing pressure to punter Cole Zwiefelhofer. ISU, meanwhile, has a reliable kicker in Tanner Fritschle and a quality returner in Taje High. Edge to the Sycamores.

INTANGIBLES We'll point to size on the lines as a key here. Indiana State's four-man defensive

line goes 6-3, 235; 6-7, 295; 6-2, 265 and 6-3, 230. The Coyotes have been undersized all season in that area and have struggled against the run. We see that playing a role in today's game, especially when USD tries to run the ball.

PREDICTION

It would be asking a lot for the Coyotes to rebound from last week and put together the kind of all-around game necessary to upset the 15th-ranked Sycamores. We'll stick with a close game that ultimately favors Indi-

- Today marks Hobo Day for South Dakota State, marking the centennial of the homecoming celebration. It is the 99th Hobo Day game, as no game was played in 1918 due to World War I and the 1943 game was played between two Army special training teams. SDSU is 58-35-5 alltime on Hobo Day.
- With 170 yards today, SDSU sophomore Zach Zenner will reach 2,000 yards rushing for his career. He has an FCSleading 1,360 yards through seven games this season, an average of 194.3 yards per
- After eclipsing 200 yards passing in each of his final seven starts a year ago, SDSU sophomore quarterback Austin Sumner has yet to reach that mark this season. His best was 192 yards against Missouri State.
- In the Jackrabbits' last home game, Oct. 13 against Western Illinois, SDSU senior wide receiver Tyrel Kool returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown. Not only did the feat win a lucky SDSU fan a four-wheeler, it set a Jackrabbit school record for longest kickoff return. It was SDSU's first kickoff return for touchdown since 2007.
- Youngstown State has been shut out in the second half in three consecutive

- Youngstown State sophomore wide receiver Christian Bryan has caught a pass in 18 consecutive games. Teammates Will Shaw (TE) and Kintrell Disher (WR) have also caught a pass in every game this season.
- Youngstown State junior quarterback Kurt Hess is three touchdown passes from the Penguins' career mark of 51, set by Tom Zetts from 2003-07. Hess currently ranks third in that category with 48 scoring
