USD Teams Finish Second In Summit League Cross Country Meet

ROCHESTER, Mich. — The South Dakota cross country teams both finished second at the Summit League Championships on Saturday with a second place finish by Jeff Mettler in the men's race and a sixth place finish by Megan Hilson (Yankton) on the women's side.

Mettler and Hilson led a contingent of seven Coyotes who earned all-conference honors at the meet. Freshmen Mubarik Musa and Amber Eickhorn were also named conference newcomers of the year on top of earning all-conference status.

South Dakota State won the eight-team men's race with 35 points. South Dakota had 62, IUPUI had 104,

Oakland had 111 and Western Illinois tallied 119 to finish in the top-five.

The women's race was won by North Dakota State with 36 points. South Dakota's 59, South Dakota State's 63, Oakland's 114 and Omaha's 157 rounded out the top-five in the nine-team field.

Mettler crossed the finish line of the 8k race in a time of 25:10.6, which was four seconds behind race winner Michael Krsnak of South Dakota State. Ethan Marquardt placed seventh in 25:49.1 and Musa was eighth in 25:58.8.

Mettler and Marquardt were named first-team all-conference, while Musa earned second-team all-

conference honors.

Isaac Allen finished 22nd in 26:43.5, and Alex Hohenthanner (Yankton) was 23rd in 26:44.1. Brant Haase crossed the finish line in 26:55.8 and Benson Langat crossed in 27:23.9 to finish in 28th and 40th, respectively.

Hilson earned first-team all-conference with her sixth place finish in 22:23.7. Her time was about 34 seconds behind race winner Brittni Hutton of Oakland (21:49.8).

Three Coyote women made second-team all-conference, led by Eickhorn's 11th place finish in 22:51.0. Katie Wetzstein's 12th place in 22:54.4 and Ali Gress' 14th place in 22:57.7 also earned second-team honors.

Carol Miller had a strong finish with a 16th in 23:05.4. Jessica Brandli finished 24th in 23:30.8 and Britni Waller was 25th in 23:31.1. Kristin Steffen (Crofton, Neb.) placed 43rd, while Jilanne Doom (Wagner) finished 62nd.

Yankton native Jared Ailts (Sr.) was South Dakota State's third runner, placing sixth overall in 25:30.3. For the SDSU women, freshman Jenna Grossenburg (Yankton) placed 37th, senior Krista Creager finished 46th.

The Coyotes are next scheduled to race at the NCAA Midwest Regional on Nov. 10 in Springfield, Mo.

BROOKINGS — Six South Dakota State seniors played their final volleyball match in Frost Arena on Saturday on the anniversary of the 100th Hobo Day, and they made it a memorable one with a 3-2 win over Fort Wayne in front of a Hobo Day crowd of 579 fans.

The Jackrabbits, who won by the set scores of 25-20, 22-25, 26-24, 26-28 and 15-11, also snapped a 10 matchlosing streak to the Mastodons, dating back to Nov. 17, 2007, when the Jacks downed the Dons in The Summit League Tournament championship match, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

SDSU improves to 16-9 overall with the win and to 8-5 in The Summit League. IPFW falls to 21-5 overall, and to 10-3 in the league.

Led by senior Kelli Fiegen (Parkston), who posted her second straight double-double with 15 kills and 10 total blocks, the Jacks finished with a 17-12 advantage in total team blocks.

Margit Hansing also posted her second consecutive double-double, finishing with 13 kills to go along with her team and career-high 24 digs. Kelly Herrmann made it three double-doubles for the Jacks with her 10 kills and 19 digs.

Shay Birath led the Jacks with 22 digs, and remains well on pace to break the all-time digs mark of 1,929. She finished the weekend with 1,891 career digs, 39 shy of a new record.

Emily Spencer led the Mastodons with 29 kills, taking 91 swings in the match to reach that total. Jessie Manwaring added 16 and Haile Ripley 10 kills in the loss. Spencer also added 21 digs to complete her double-double. Tessa McGill led the Dons with 45 digs in the loss.

The Jackrabbits return home for one more match, when they host Iowa State on Tuesday at Frost Arena in a match that can be seen live on Midco Sports Net. The Jackrabbits and Cyclones get started at 7 p.m.

**NEBRASKA 23, NO. 20 MICHIGAN 9:** LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — Ameer Abdullah ran for 101 yards and a touchdown and Nebraska took control of the Big Ten Legends Division with a 23-9 victory over No. 20 Michigan on Saturday night.

Wolverines quarterback Denard Robinson left the game late in the first half with a right elbow injury. Robinson, who spent the second half on the sideline in an overcoat, watched as freshman backup Russell Bellomy threw three interceptions.

The Huskers (6-2, 3-1) moved into a first-place tie with Michigan in the Legends but own the tiebreaker.

Michigan (5-3, 3-1) generated a season-low 188 yards during its first visit to Memorial Stadium since 1911. The Wolverines had 52 in the second half.

It was the second straight game Michigan failed to score a touchdown.

Taylor Martinez was 14 of 24 for 166 yards, with an interception. Bellomy was 3 of 16 for 38 yards.

**NORTHWESTERN 28, IOWA 17:** EVANSTON, Ill. (AP) — Kam Colter scored three rushing touchdowns and threw for another score as Northwestern defeated Iowa 28-17 on Saturday.

The Wildcats (7-2, 3-2 Big Ten) have been

struggling with their passing game, but had success running the ball. Colter rushed for 166 yards and Vennir Mark ran for 162 yards. Mark became Northwestern's first 1,000-yard rusher since Tyrell Sutton in 2006.

Northwestern has won four of its last five against the Hawkeyes (4-3, 2-1), who fell further out of contention in the Big Ten Legends Division. Iowa was hurt by sacks, penalties and lack of execution on offense.

Running back Mark Weisman, a native of Buffalo Grove, Ill., exited late in the second quarter with an injury and rushed for just 21 yards. Damon Bullock handled most of the rushing and finished with 107 yards.

**IOWA STATE 35, BAYLOR 21:** IOWA CITY, Iowa (AP) — Steele Janitz set career highs with 381 yards passing and five touchdowns and Iowa State held off visiting Baylor 35-21 to snap a two-game losing streak.

Janitz tied a school record with 36 completions to lead the Iowa State (5-3, 2-3 Big 12), who moved within one win of bowl eligibility for the third time in four years.

Janitz started for the first time since late September. He responded with one of the best quarterback performances in school history. Three of Janitz's touchdowns went to Jarvis West, whose 22-yard touchdown catch with 8:37 left made it 35-14 Cyclones.

Nick Florence threw for 426 yards and two touchdowns to lead Baylor (3-4, 0-4) which lost its fourth straight game.

**MINNESOTA 44, PURDUE 28:** MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Freshman Philip Nelson threw three touchdown passes in the first half of his second college start for Minnesota, and the Gophers breezed to their first Big Ten victory of the season by beating Purdue 44-28 on Saturday afternoon.

Nelson led Minnesota (5-3, 1-3 Big Ten) to touchdowns on four straight possessions while the Gophers averaged almost 10 yards per play. He completed 12 straight passes in one stretch and had all 246 of his yards in the first half on the way to a 34-7 lead, more points than Minnesota had in any game last year.

Purdue's Caleb TerBush was pulled for Robert Marve in the third quarter for Purdue (3-5, 0-4) after finishing 5 for 18 for 49 yards and an interception that Michael Carter returned 43 yards for a score.

**MVFC**  
**N. DAKOTA ST. 23, S. ILLINOIS 17:** FARGO, N.D. (AP) — John Crockett's 5-yard touchdown run with 5:23 to play gave North Dakota State a 23-17 win over Southern Illinois Saturday.

The Bison (7-1, 4-1 Missouri Valley), who suffered their only loss of the season in their last home game two weeks ago against Indiana State, trailed 17-10 entering the fourth quarter. Derrick Lang's 1-yard run with 12:38 remaining tied it and North Dakota State used a 11-play, 52-yard drive to score the winning TD.

Southern Illinois (5-4, 4-2) scored on Kory Faulkner's 32-yard pass to LaSteven McKinney and on Brand Williams' 55-yard fumble return. The Salukis only managed 11 rushing yards to North Dakota State's 186.

Brock Jensen ran for a score and completed 15 of 25 passes for 200 yards for the Bison. Faulkner was 17 of 26 for 166 yards for SIU.

**MISSOURI STATE 42, WESTERN ILLINOIS 3:** SPRINGFIELD, Mo. (AP) — Kierra Harris threw for three touchdowns and ran for another. Mikeal Cooper-Falls added 95 yards rushing and a score, and Missouri State dominated Western Illinois 42-3 on Saturday for the Bears' first three-game winning streak in eight years.

Harris completed just 13 passes and was intercepted three times, but he managed to find Dorian Buford, Trey Kelley and Cadarius Dotson for scores. Cedric Miller added a rushing score for the Bears (3-6, 3-3 Missouri Valley), who last strung together three wins Sept. 2-18, 2004.

Harris opened the scoring with a 38-yarder to Buford in the first quarter, then found Kelley and Dotson on short scoring passes in the second before running it in from the 1 just before halftime. That gave the Bears a 28-3 halftime lead.

The Leathernecks (3-5, 1-4) got 75 yards rushing from Cautlon Ray and 72 from Nikko Watson. Pat Smith kicked a 27-yard field goal.

**ILLINOIS STATE 33, NORTHERN IOWA 21:** CEDAR FALLS, Iowa (AP) — Matt Brown threw for two touchdowns and ran for another as Illinois State beat Northern Iowa 33-21 on Saturday night.

Brown was 22 of 27 for 274 yards and two touchdowns — a 76-yard pass to Tyrone Walker and a 49-yard pass to James O'Shaughnessy. Brown kept the ball and scored on a 1-yard run in the first quarter.

Cameron Ruffin got the scoring started for Illinois State (7-2, 4-2 Missouri Valley) with a 19-yard run into the end zone. Darrelynn Dunn rushed in for a 1-yard touchdown in the fourth for the Redbirds.

Sawyer Kollmorgen was 20 of 48 for 218 yards for Northern Iowa (2-6, 1-4). Kollmorgen kept the ball for the Panthers first touchdown, scoring on a 6-yard run. He later threw a 2-yard TD pass to Chad Owens. David Johnson scored on a 5-yard run in the fourth, finishing with 20 carries for 118 yards.

Amanda Dirksen, and freshman Bailey Kuchta had six kills apiece for MMC. Caitlyn Illg, Kristen Boyle and Lexie Branson each had three kills. Illg posted 19 assists, with Rowbotham recording six.

That balance on offense — with six different hitters coming into the match with over 100 kills on the season — makes things easier offensively, according to Illg, the Lancers' sophomore setter.

"Wherever I set it, I'm confident that the hitter will get things done," she said.

"We're closing in on a lot of records."

MMC switched to a one-setter offense midway through the match, keeping Illg on in the front row, but still utilizing the senior Rowbotham as a passer.

"We could tell that our offense was running a little better with one setter out there," said Mount Marty head coach Candice Climer. "Defensively we needed to pick it up when they would hit line, and Tina kept picking it up."

Kuchta had six digs, with Illg and Dirksen each recording five.

After Midland made quick work of the Lancers in the first two sets, MMC solidi-

fied its serve-receive and did not allow an ace serve in the third set. That helped the Lancers stay in the game, remaining within a point of the Warriors until a 4-0 run late widened a 17-16 margin.

"In the first two sets, we played a lot of defense but we couldn't get the ball to drop on their side," Climer said. "They're scrappy, and we couldn't put it away on them."

Midland now prepares for a tough final week, beginning with a game at sixth-ranked Hastings on Tuesday. The Warriors also take on Nebraska Wesleyan on the road before hosting Morningside in their regular season finale.

"Our next three matches are challenging, and the next two are on the road. That's why today's win was so big," Giesselmann said. "Nobody's solved Hastings yet. You have to play at a high level mentally and physically every point. If you take one point off, that could be the difference."

MMC, now 7-22 and 1-12 travels to Northwestern on Tuesday. The Raiders took Hastings to five sets before falling on Saturday.

"The biggest thing I'd like to see is that we put up a fight every game," Climer said.
