





CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly fell Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery fell 5.75 cents to \$8.58 a bushel; December corn slipped 0.75 cent to \$7.37 a bushel; December oats fell 2 cents to \$3.8775 a bushel; while November soybeans fell 34 cents to \$15.2725 a bushel.

Beef futures rose, while pork futures fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

December live cattle rose 0.02 cent to \$1.2527 a pound; November feeder cattle rose 0.60 cent to \$1.4592 a pound; while December lean hogs fell 1.10 cent to 77.80 cents a pound.
