Search Continues For Missing Yankton Woman

Despite several reports of a missing Yankton woman's whereabouts, authorities say they do not have any confirmed sightings yet.

The Yankton Police Department issued a missing or endangered person alert for 55-year-old Marilyn Coulter Oct. 17. She was last seen at approximately noon Oct. 16 in Yankton.

"We have received several reports of Ms. Coulter being in the Sioux Falls area," a press release issued Tuesday by the police department stated. "None of these reported sightings have proven to be that of Ms. Coulter."

Police say Coulter has a history of leaving the area by way of hitchhiking and has been entered into nationwide databases for missing/endangered persons.

Coulter is described as 5 foot, 9 inches in height and weighs 224 pounds. She has brown hair and eyes.

According to police, she is without needed medication and suffers from mental illness, which may cause her to become violent.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly rose Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Highway Superintendent Finalists Down To Three

The Yankton County Commission narrowed down the applicants for its highway superintendent position during a special meeting Tuesday.

During an executive session, commissioners whittled down the 11 applicants to three finalists. Interviews are tentatively scheduled to take place with the three candidates Nov. 10.

Current Highway Superintendent Alan Sorensen turned in his resignation in September. His last day will be Dec. 13.

The commission has said it wants to have Sorensen's replacement on staff by the beginning of

December so there is a smooth transition.

A restructuring of the department is under way, and the description of the highway superintendent has been changed. The position will now be oriented more toward activities such as writing grants and drawing up long-term road and bridge plans than it has been in the past.

Also Tuesday, the commission voted to put out a request for proposals to auctioneers for the planned auctioning off of the former highway maintenance shop property in the 400 block of West 11th Street.
