CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for December delivery fell 4.50 cents to \$6.7850 a bushel; December corn fell 12.50 cents to 4.4150 a bushel; December oats were 2.50 cents higher at \$3.1925 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 37 cents to \$12.8275 a bushel.
Beef was mixed while pork prices fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
December live cattle fell .10 cent to \$1.3197 a pound; November feeder cattle rose .28 cent to \$1.6520 a pound; while December lean hogs were 1.50 cents lower at \$8.662 a pound.
