South Dakota State was held to an uncharacteristically low minus-32 yards rushing in last Saturday's 20-0 home loss to North Dakota State.

So yes, re-establishing the run is a key of the Jackrabbits (3-2, 0-1), heading into Saturday's home game with Southern Illinois.

"To me, it's more fundamental than a scheme thing," SDSU head coach John Stiegelmeier said Tuesday.

"That's what our solution is. "Passing the ball to set up the run game, I'm not sure how good that works, other than maybe getting a guy away from your formation."

The veteran coach pointed to blocking and taking advantage of the "numbers game" as areas of improvement for the Jacks.

Junior running back Zach Zenner was limited to four yards on eight carries by the Bison, while junior quarterback Austin Sumner was

sacked seven times. SDSU's defensive line has also struggled of late, Stiegelmeier said — calling the line the "strength" of the defense, but an area that has been "frustrated" the last few games.

"They haven't been making as many plays as we expected, especially in the passing game," he said.

"There's nothing you can do on the board, our schemes are sound."
