S. Dakota Supreme Court Justice, USD Alum Lori Wilbur To Preside Over 99th Dakota Days Parade

VERMILLION — South Dakota Supreme Court Justice Lori Wilbur, '74, '77, will serve as Parade Marshal for the 99th Dakota Days Parade at 10 a.m. on Saturday, Oct. 5.

The 48th justice in the history of the South Dakota Supreme Court and the second female justice, Wilbur was appointed to the state's highest court in 2011 by Gov. Dennis Daugaard. She graduated from USD with a bachelor's degree in 1974 and earned her law degree from the USD School of Law in 1977.

Wilbur represents the Fourth Supreme Court District, which is comprised of Union, Clay, Yankton, Hutchinson, Hanson, Davison, Bon Homme, Douglas, Aurora, Brule, Charles Mix, Gregory, Tripp, Lyman, McCook, Turner counties and a portion of Lincoln County. She has held every judicial

Sixth Circuit as presiding judge since 2007, and she served as a replacement justice on about 20 state Supreme Court cases. As a circuit judge, Wilbur led the Sixth Circuit's DUI Court program, which is an alternative sentencing program that seeks to address defendants' underlying addictions. A Madison, native, she and her late husband, Brent, have two grown daughters.

Flooded Farm Land Applications Due Nov. 1

Landowners who qualify for a reduction in assessed value on their flooded crop land must turn the needed paperwork in to their local assessor's office (Director of Equalization) by Nov. 1.

Land that can't be planted because it is flooded may be eligible for a reduction in assessed value. Applications must be submitted each year accompanied by current Farm Service Agency maps with flooded areas clearly marked. The paperwork must be dropped off at the Director of Equalization Office or postmarked by Nov. 1.

Lakes, dugouts and land in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) are not eligible.

Flooded farm land applications are available at the Director of Equalization Office. In Yankton County, that office is in the County Government Center, 121 West Third Street, Suite 203, Yankton.
