son said. "They're all familiar with each other. Summer is a full-time thing for these kids."

Does having basketball players on the team help? Sure, but not necessarily when it comes to eventually making a post-season run, says coach Johnson.

"They're different skills," she said. "We have some younger kids who have never fought for state in volleyball."

To that end, Crofton boasts just three seniors on its roster, McKenzie Johnson, Kaylee Hoffman and Amy Mueller. There are three jun-

iors (Wortmann, Lily Steffen, Allison Arens), five sophomores (Allison Tramp, Brittany Guenther, Bre Allen, Samantha Stewart, Katie Petersen) and two freshmen (Kelsey Sanger, Monica Arens).

Such youth has played a role in Crofton's two losses this season, to Class C1 Wayne and to Lutheran High Northeast last Saturday.

"In our losses, it's been the mental side that got us," coach Johnson said.

A big key for the team in its wins has come on simple things, Wortmann said.

"Our serve receive has gotten a lot better," she said. "We can keep the ball going longer, to get to our offense. That's a huge difference."

The Lady Warriors are

also hoping their season extends longer than in previous years. Crofton, seeded No. 7 in Class C2 points, has not qualified for the state volleyball tournament since 1993.

Getting that far won't be easy, coach Johnson said, especially when it comes to advance out of sub-districts and districts.

"It all just depends on what team we have that night," she said. "We need to have everything clicking."

Confidence, though, doesn't figure to be an issue.

"It's our year," McKenzie Johnson said, with a smile.
