

Free Vaccinations Scheduled For YSD Students

For the seventh consecutive year, the South Dakota Department of Health, Yankton School District and Avera Sacred Heart Hospital is offering free Seasonal Flu vaccines for children in grades JK-12th grade.

Vaccinating children helps protect them from serious influenza illness and complications and decreases the spread of influenza in the community, as children are often the biggest spreaders of influenza to adults and other children.

Children under the age of 9 years will need two doses of vaccine separated by 4 weeks if they are receiving influenza vaccine for the first time or if they have never had 2 doses of seasonal vaccine and 1 dose of an H1N1 containing vaccine. Parents will need to make an appointment with their healthcare provider to get the second dose.

The state is supplying the vaccine free of charge, and there will be no administration fee at school-based clinics.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

A free Seasonal Flu clinic will be held

for children in Jr. Kindergarten through grade 5 at each elementary school. Parents need not be present but the attached consent form must be signed by a parent for all students wishing to get the vaccine in school. Return these forms to your child's teacher or the school office by Tuesday, Oct. 8. Below is the schedule for each elementary school

- Beadle School — Tuesday, Oct. 15: Morning
- Lincoln School — Tuesday, Oct. 15: Noon
- Stewart School — Thursday, Oct. 17: Morning
- Webster School — Thursday, Oct. 17: Morning (mid-late)

MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS

A free Seasonal Flu clinic will be held for the middle school students at the Yankton Middle School on Wednesday, Oct. 16, in the morning at approximately 11 a.m. Parents need not be present but the attached consent form must be signed by a parent for all students wishing to get the vaccine in school. Please return the

consent form to the office by Tuesday, Oct. 8.

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

A free Seasonal Flu clinic for all high school students will be held in the morning at the Yankton High School on Wednesday, Oct. 16. Parents need not be present but the attached consent form must be signed by a parent for all students under the age of 18. Students age 18 and older may sign their own forms. Return the form to the office by Tuesday, Oct. 8.

These clinics are being offered free of charge with no administration fee and are sponsored by the Avera Sacred Heart Pediatric Nurses, Yankton School District Nurses and Community Health Nurses. If you have any questions relating to the vaccine or the scheduled clinics, contact Renee Tereshinski at Avera Sacred Heart Hospital, 668-8219, or one of the Yankton School District Nurses.

Guard Drill Cancelled Due To Shutdown

RAPID CITY — The South Dakota Air and Army National Guard has cancelled the Oct. 5-6 scheduled drill assembly as a result of the government shutdown.

Due to the lapse in federal appropriations, select units of the South Dakota National Guard are in the process of contacting their members to inform assigned Soldiers and Airmen that drill is canceled for this upcoming weekend and, provided the federal government passes a budget for 2014 or a long-term Continuing Resolution, is rescheduled for Oct. 18-19.

Not all South Dakota National Guard units are affected by the decision to reschedule the 5-6 October drill assembly. Units preparing for an upcoming mobilization will still drill and some units were scheduled to drill on other weekends in October. Soldiers and Airmen of the state National Guard are encouraged to contact their units for further guidance on scheduled drill assembly for October.

In spite of the government shutdown, the National Guard remains available for call-up in the event of a natural disaster or state emergency.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery rose 3.25 cents to \$6.8925 a bushel; December corn rose .25 cent at 4.3925 a bushel; December oats were 3.25 cents higher at \$3.17 a bushel; while November soybeans advanced 14.50 cents to

\$12.8825 a bushel. Beef was lower while pork prices rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle fell .05 cent to \$1.3177 a pound; November feeder cattle fell .58 cent to \$1.6562 a pound; while December lean hogs were .60 cent higher at \$8.677 a pound.
