

# Volleyball: Pierre Avenges Loss To Yankton

PIERRE — The Pierre Lady Gavs avenged an earlier loss to Yankton, beating the Gazelles 25-17, 25-9, 25-15 in Eastern South Dakota Conference volleyball action on Friday.

Kaitlyn Severyn posted 12 kills, four ace serves and 14 digs to lead Pierre (5-8, 4-6 ESD). Kallie Stout had 12 digs and Whitney King had 23 assists in the victory.

For Yankton (1-10, 1-8 ESD), Becky Frick had five kills, two blocks and seven digs to lead the way. Joselyn Salvatori recorded 10 digs and Sophie Drotzmann added three blocks for the Gazelles.

Yankton scored a 3-2 win over Pierre on Sept. 7, but has struggled since.

“When we played Pierre the first time, we had improved every match until that point,” said Yankton head coach Tiffany Beste. “Right now we’re getting down on ourselves easily.”

Pierre travels to Sioux Falls Washington today (Saturday). Yankton hosts Huron on Tuesday.

“We’re passing well and giving our offense a chance,” Beste said. “We have to find a way to score points. If we can do the little things and focus on the positives, we can do that.”

Pierre won the JV match 25-22, 25-27, 15-7. For Yankton, Hannah Bockholt had nine kills, Morgyn Jaquith had 11 assists and Joselyn Salvatori added 10 digs.

Yankton won the sophomore match 25-20, 25-19. For the Gazelles, Josie Saylor recorded five kills and four blocks, and Ellie Fedders had nine assists to lead the way. Danielle Salvatori and Lindsey Hale had eight digs each in the win.

The Gazelles won the freshmen ‘A’ match 25-19, 19-25, 15-10. Kami Cornemann had 12 kills and Katie Hauser had 13 assists and six digs to lead the way. Darian Tramp had six ace serves in the victory.

Yankton also won the freshmen ‘B’ match 17-25, 25-

# 79-Year-Old Hylton Says Good Bye To Racing

KANSAS CITY, Kan. (AP) — James Hylton gingerly climbed out of his No. 48 car after an ARCA test at Kansas Speedway on Friday, and nobody could blame him for moving a little bit slower than his competitors.

He's 79 years old, after all.

The oldest driver to race in each of NASCAR's three highest divisions, Hylton was calling it a career after Friday night's race. The Cup rookie of the year in 1966, Hylton has spent the last several years of his career racing in the ARCA series.

"I know it's going to be very painful, especially the way this car drives. To be out there running with some of the top guys — before I'd see them disappear, now I can keep them in sight," Hylton told The Associated Press. "It's a tremendous feeling. To know at the end of the day it'll all be kind of like a dream. It'll be gone but I'm going to make the best of it."

Hylton's friends put together a car they believe can compete at Kansas, and it even sports a gold paint scheme that honors the early years of his racing career.

Born on his family's farm in Virginia in 1934, Hylton's family had to work hard to make ends meet during the Depression. Hylton remembers toiling in the fields all day to help out.

He started driving in his father's Ford Model T — his brother taught him how to work the pedals. And from that humble beginning, Hylton embarked on a winding career in motorsports. He served as a mechanic for Rex White and then a crew chief for Ned Jarrett in the early days of NASCAR, then got back behind the wheel and placed second in the Cup standings in 1966.
